The Inland Empire Utilities Agency (IEUA) provides environmental education field trips, presentations, and materials to schools at no cost. Programs are related to water quality, conservation, and the local ecosystem.

> IEUA in partnership with the Santa Ana Watershed Association (SAWA) offer **free field trips** to the Chino Creek Wetlands and Educational Park in the city of Chino. The Water Discovery Field Trip program focuses on water conservation, wetlands, and watershed issues. By incorporating hands-on activities with State Standards, naturalists engage students to learn about current water and environmental challenges in a fun. outdoor environment. Field trips average 4 hours.

The Water Discovery Program and Bussing Mini-Grant program are partially funded by a grant from the **California Department of Parks and Recreation** The Chino Creek Wetlands and Educational Park is partially funded by a grant from the State Water Resources Control Board

IEUA in partnership with SAWA offers a **Bussing** Mini-Grant which allows for schools and organizations to apply for transportation funding to and from the Chino Creek Wetlands and Educational Park to take part in the Water Discovery Field Trip program.



IEUA in partnership with SAWA and the City of Chino holds an annual Earth Day Celebration at the Chino Creek Park. Field trips and bussing grants are available for this annual event.

The Earth Day Event is partially funded by a grant from the California Department of Parks and Recreation



The Garden In Every School® Program provides a grant to schools and assists with the creation and construction of a water-wise school garden. Gardens feature low water use plants and irrigation and includes lesson plans, aligned with state curriculum.

Water is Life Student Art Poster Contest: Students in grades K-12 are invited to create an art poster depicting various water uses, ways to use water more efficiently, or water conservation topics. The





Teacher workshops, such as Project WET, grants, lesson plans and activities are available through the Water **Education Water Awareness** Committee (WEWAC).
