UPDATE CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITY ON EUCALYPTUS AVENUE

Project Date Change: April 17-23, 2014

Dear Resident/School/Emergency Responder:

WHAT: Construction activity will take place on Eucalyptus Avenue (two locations). Traffic will be permitted in both directions on Eucalyptus Avenue. There will be two flagmen onsite controlling the flow of traffic. Commuters can expect traffic delays. The first location will be near the entrance to the Chino Hills Community Sports Park. The second will take place approximately 50-feet west of the Chino Hills Community Sports Park entrance.


DATES: April 17, 2014 through April 23, 2014. (Project originally scheduled for completion April 18, 2014. The date

has been extended due to construction. Rain delay may occur)

WHERE: West bound lane of Eucalyptus Avenue near the entrance to Chino Hills Community Sports

WORK HOURS: Thursday - Friday 8:30 am – 4:00 pm

IMPACTS: Expect traffic delays up to 10 minutes.



Benefiting the residents and businesses of Chino Hills and Chino, this project will provide recycled water as an additional source of water for landscape irrigation use and groundwater recharge. This project will save approximately 90 million-gallons per year of drinking water, while helping to drought proof IEUA's service area and keeping the cost of water low, providing a reliable source of alternative water.
