



## **PUBLIC INFORMATION NOTICE #11 FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE 930 ZONE RECYCLED WATER RESERVOIR PROJECT**

Date: October 31, 2013

Dear Resident:

The Inland Empire Utilities Agency's (IEUA) has been working closely with the City of Chino Hills on the landscape and aesthetics plan for the reservoir site. It has been agreed that IEUA's contractor will install an eight feet tall, green colored poly-vinyl coated chain link fence, including green slats inserted into the chain link fencing. Generally, the fencing will be placed along the top of the existing berm on the southwest side and midway along northerly slope below the ridgeline. The fence will surround the entire reservoir site upon completion. Additionally, the reservoir will be painted a city approved green color which will aid in camouflaging the top portion of the reservoir which may be visible from higher elevations. This same color is used on a city reservoir located in the Vellano Development.

A mockup of the fencing was installed earlier this week along the southwest portion of the berm indicating the height of the fence. This is used only to reflect the height of the fence within view of Galloping Hills Road.

The fence installation is expected to take place late spring to early summer (pending rain delays) once the reservoir construction is complete and the landscaping has been installed.
