





## Tributary Sewer Flows






## Projected Influent Flows






## Flow Diversion Alternatives

Goal: optimize flow diversions for efficient operation and maximized RW Use

## Alternatives:

- 1. Do Nothing
- Pump Whispering Lakes and Haven sewer flows to RP-1
- Construct regional sewer lift station and treat at RP-1
- Treat sewer flows at RP-5 and pump RW to RP-1

## Preferred Alternative:

- Alternative 2
- Includes RW Pump Station (Southern Zones) upgrades in later years

## Preferred Alternative

## IMPACTS

- Expand secondary system at RP-1
  - Expand RP-5 to22.5 MGD
- Upsize Whispering
  Lakes Pump
  Station to 4.7 MGD
  - Upsize MontclairInterceptor to meetcapacity



# Process and Site Layout Planning

## **Technology**

- Advanced treatment system
- MBR process for recycled water injection
- Site layouts based on ultimate influent flows and MBR footprint

## **Expansion Needs**

- RP-1: Secondary Treatment (MBR), Secondary Clarifiers (eliminate Primary equalization), Digesters
- RP-5: Gravity Thickener, DAFT, Anaerobic Digestion, Dewatering, Biofilters


