

The Inland Empire Utilities Agency (IEUA) is pleased to provide environmental education field trips, presentations and materials to schools at no cost. Programs are offered to K-12 students and focus on water quality, conservation, the local ecosystem, and environmental stewardship.



IEUA offers **free field trips** to the Chino Creek Wetlands and Educational Park in the city of Chino. The Water Discovery Field Trip program focuses on water conservation, wetlands and watershed issues. The program incorporates handson activities tailored to grade levels, aligned with state and science standards and engages students in learning about

current water and environmental challenges in a fun, outdoor environment.

The Water Discovery Program and Busing Mini-Grant program are partially funded by a grant from the California Department of Parks and Recreation. The Chino Creek Wetlands and Educational Park is partially funded by a grant from the State Water Resources Control Board.

IEUA offers a **Busing Mini-Grant**, which allows for schools and organizations to apply for transportation funding to and from the Chino Creek Wetlands and Educational Park to take part in the Water Discovery Field Trip program.



IEUA, in partnership with the city of Chino, holds an annual **Earth Day Celebration** at the Chino Creek Wetlands and Educational Park for elementary school students. Students participate in a variety of activities. Scheduled field trips and busing grants are available for this annual event.



The **Garden In Every School® Program** provides a grant to schools and assists with the creation and construction of a low water use school garden. Gardens feature water-wise plants and efficient irrigation, and includes lesson plans aligned with the Common Core Standards and Next Generation Science Standards. Schools must be within IEUA's service area to qualify.

Water is Life Student Art Poster Contest: Students in Grades K-12 within IEUA's service area are invited to create an art poster depicting various water



uses, ways to use water more efficiently or water conservation topics. The contest runs through winter.



Grants, scholarships and contests are available through the **Water Education Water Awareness Committee** (WEWAC). The mission of the WEWAC to promote water-use efficiency and to increase public awareness of the importance of water in southern California.
