These guidelines are designed to assess how well the entity's budget serves as:

- a policy document
- a financial plan
- an operations guide
- a communication device

The budget document must be rated "proficient" in all four categories, including additional mandatory criteria within those categories.

"IEUA's receipt of this award exemplifies our continuing commitment to the values of fiscal responsibility, efficient business practices, accountability, and dedication to transparency."
