


Chino Basin Project Approved for Proposition 1 Funding

Full funding was unanimously approved by the California Water Commission for Tier 2 projects at a hearing on July 24, 2018. The funding will include IEUA's Chino Basin Conjunctive Use Environmental Water Storage/Exchange Program (Chino Basin Project), which has been approved for \$206.9 million. This project involves the construction of an advanced water treatment facility and distribution system that will treat and store up to 15,000 acre-feet per year of recycled water in the Chino Basin Water Bank for a new local water supply. The funding for this program comes from Proposition 1, a state water bond approved by voters in 2014, to invest \$2.7 billion for new water storage projects.

HOW THE PROJECT WORKS

- Secure non-potable local water supplies
 - Recycled water, brackish groundwater and industrial discharges
- Treat by advanced water technology (e.g. reverse osmosis)
- Recharge and store treated water in Chino groundwater basin
- Pump groundwater from storage to local SWP Contractor
 - Water conveyed through existing infrastructure and sent to Southern California customers
- SWP Contractor transfers equivalent amount of water at Oroville reservoir
 - Water held in storage at Oroville until needed for environmental benefits
- Water released during dry and critically-dry years to Feather River
 - Pulse flows to mimic storm events
- Water flows downstream to Delta



IEUA and Chino Basin Watermaster Implement Water Smart Drought Response

The Water Smart Drought Response Program focuses on increasing water management flexibility and reducing the need for drought emergency response actions. The project received a \$750,000 grant award from the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation for the Chino Basin Watermaster's Recharge Master Plan Update 23a Wineville, Jurupa and RP-3 Basins Improvement Project. The improvements made on IEUA's Wineville Basin and Jurupa Basin will enable IEUA to annually divert, capture and recharge an additional 2,760 acre-feet annually for the region's future uses.

IEUA Celebrates Smart Irrigation Month in July



Smart irrigation is the effective use of outdoor watering through feasible and innovative technologies. The Irrigation Association started this public outreach campaign in 2005 to educate the public about the importance of using water efficiently outdoors through simple practices and innovative technologies. Landscape irrigation accounts for more than 60% of the average household water usage, which is why using smart controllers and updating existing irrigation systems can assist in eliminating water waste. In honor of Smart Irrigation month, IEUA gave away free hose nozzles for the entire month.

IEUA recommends following these important tips during the hot months of summer:

- Water responsibly by adhering to the city's/water district's ordinances that may include restrictions on watering schedules and water waste.
- Water your landscape a few minutes at a time while looking out for runoff.
- Detect and repair all leaks.
- Install high efficiency sprinkler nozzles (rebate available), drip irrigation or moisture sensor systems on irrigation systems.
- Consider replacing your existing irrigation controller with a Smart Controller. Smart
 Controllers save water by automatically adjusting to changes in the weather and the
 needs of your landscape, and account for plant types, soil conditions, location, climate,
 and other landscape conditions.

Rebates for Eligible Water Saving Programs

Metropolitan Water District's new Landscape Transformation Program provides residential and commercial applicants with rebates of \$1 for each square foot of turf to be replaced with native water efficient plants and irrigation systems. Applicants who reside in IEUA's service area are eligible for an additional \$1 per square foot, totaling \$2 for each square foot replaced. Together, IEUA and Metropolitan Water District offer additional incentives for high-efficiency washing machines, premium high-efficiency toilets, weather based irrigation controllers, and more.

Water Efficiency Legislation Signed by Governor Brown

On May 31, 2018, Governor Edmund G. Brown, Jr. signed into law SB 606 by Senator Robert Hertzberg (D-Van Nuys) and AB 1668 by Assemblymember Laura Friedman (D-Glendale) to assist in preparation for drought and climate change. These bills establish statewide water efficiency standards as well as a framework for new standards to be implemented by 2022.

The two bills help strengthen the State's water resiliency in the face of uncertain water conditions. Provisions include:

- Establishing an indoor water use goal of 55 gallons per person per day until 2025, 52.5 gallons from 2025 to 2030 and 50 gallons beginning 2030;
- Creating incentives for water suppliers; such as, IEUA to recycle water; and
- Requiring both urban and agricultural water suppliers to set annual water budgets and prepare for drought.


