5. AGENCY REPRESENTATIVES' REPORTS

A. SANTA ANA WATERSHED PROJECT AUTHORITY REPORT

General Manager Shivaji Deshmukh reported that at the January 17 Commission meeting, the Commission approved the updated SAWPA Reserve Policy; authorized the rotation of officers in accordance with the historical rotation and appointed Bruce Whitaker as Commission Chair, Mike Gardner as Vice Chair, and T. Milford Harrison as Secretary-Treasurer; and adopted a resolution recognizing James D. Herberg for his contributions and dedication to public service as General Manager of the Orange County Sanitation District.

B. METROPOLITAN WATER DISTRICT OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA REPORT

General Manager Deshmukh reported that at the January 9 Special Board Meeting, the MWD Board received an update on the status of the Colorado River. Storage in Lake Powell and Lake Mead remains very low, and negotiations are underway among the basin states and the Department of the Interior to find immediate and long-term ways to reduce demand. It is expected that by the end of this year, the parties will either have agreed to a pathway forward or talks could result in litigation.

Even if the State Water Project system improves significantly, the entire MWD system is expected to stay in allocation conditions due to the status of the Colorado River. The Board did authorize \$100 million towards the purchase of spot transfers if needed.

General Manager Deshmukh reported that MWD's board awarded a contract to construct a bypass pipeline at the Wadsworth Pumping Plant as part of the water supply reliability improvements in the Rialto Pipeline service area. This contract is one component of a \$50 million project to connect our region to Diamond Valley Lake by 2024 and bring drought relief.

General Manager Deshmukh also reported that Director Camacho, who is Vice Chair at MWD, received a ten-year service pin and handed the gavel to incoming MWD Chair Ortega.

Director Camacho noted that Director Randy Record received a twenty-year service pin and two new Directors were sworn in to the MWD Board.

C. REGIONAL SEWERAGE PROGRAM POLICY COMMITTEE REPORT

There was nothing to report.

D. CHINO BASIN WATERMASTER REPORT

There was nothing to report.

E. CHINO BASIN DESALTER AUTHORITY REPORT

President Tule reported that at the January 5 Board meeting, the CDA Board approved the Annual Financial Report for Fiscal Year 2021/22 and a construction contract award for the WELL II-1 Improvements Project.

F. INLAND EMPIRE REGIONAL COMPOSTING AUTHORITY REPORT

There was nothing to report.

6. GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

General Manager Deshmukh reported that last week, the Agency held its inaugural New Hire Tour as part of the New Splash employee onboarding experience. 27 new staff participated in the tour which included stops at Carbon Canyon, RP-1, IERCF, and the Chino Desalter. General Manager Deshmukh stated he hoped that this Tour, which will be held quarterly, will help the Agency's new staff understand how their work fits into the bigger picture while simultaneously creating a networking opportunity with their peers.

General Manager Deshmukh provided a water supply update, noting that the current storm in Northern California is the last of five storms projected through the end of January. These storms provided precipitation levels of nearly 160% of average to date and snow/water content levels of roughly 200%. Storage levels continue to improve in the key SWP reservoirs of Lake Oroville and San Luis Reservoir. Lake Oroville is at 104% of its historical average and recently passed the storage level on this date in 2022. San Luis Reservoir is still below normal levels at 66% of average for this date but should begin to fill quickly now that regulatory releases are complete. Further, MWD did allocate additional Water Surplus and Drought Management supplies to IEUA under the Emergency Water Conservation Plan, but we do not expect any significant increases until the SWP allocation passes 15%.

The Agency did receive an indication from MWD that the SWP allocation may increase ahead of the normal February timeline, but increases are expected to be modest given reservoir levels and a general cautiousness given the way the water year unfolded last year. Finally, as Director Camacho noted, we still expect some type of shortage allocation from Metropolitan in 2023.

General Manager Deshmukh noted that Director Hall had requested the Human Health and Safety Water numbers at a previous Board meeting. He reported that the human health and safety water for June 1 through December 31, 2022, was 147,117 acre-feet (AF) while IEUA's share was 19,230 AF. For January 1 through June 30, 2023, that is set for 144,315 AF while IEUA's allotment is 3,206 AF.

General Manager Deshmukh added that IEUA's Groundwater Recharge team conducted field inspections and monitoring of basin level readings throughout the recent storms. Overall stormwater capture is estimated at 5,100 AF which converts to 1.6 billion gallons of water in the region.

7. BOARD OF DIRECTORS' REQUESTED FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS

Director Hofer asked about the deadline for the negotiations on the Colorado River and what agencies are involved in the ongoing litigation. Director Hofer requested how much water flowed down to the Santa Ana River during this last storm.

Vice President Elie stated that he attended the IEUA End of the Year Celebration on December 21.

Executive Summary:

Through the Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) Enterprise System Project and consistent with the Inland Empire Utilities Agency (IEUA) SCADA Master Plan, the control systems at each IEUA treatment plant have been migrated to the standardized software platform, Rockwell PlantPAx, except at the Regional Recycling Plant No.1 (RP-1) in which DeviceNet is the communication protocol that is currently used. The RP-1 SCADA Migration construction phase will start in Spring 2023, and new technology installed as part of this project will not support DeviceNet. Additionally, DeviceNet is being discontinued by Rockwell, and better protocols, such as Ethernet, are available. The purpose of this project is to develop a design to replace all devices that are using DeviceNet throughout RP-1. These devices include VFD drives, DeviceNet starter auxiliaries, and Electronic Overload Relays located in Motor Control Centers.

On October 12, 2022, IEUA issued a request for proposals to design consultants listed on PlanetBids. On November 30, 2022, IEUA received two proposals. The IEUA evaluation panel determined that the most qualified consultant was Eramosa International Inc., with a design fee of \$465,918.

Staff's Recommendation:

- 1. Award a design consultant contract for the RP-1 DeviceNet Replacement, Project No. EN23000, to Eramosa International Inc., for the not-to-exceed amount of \$465,918; and
- 2. Authorize the General Manager to execute the contract, subject to non-substantive changes.





The IEUA External and Government Affairs Department, as the lead coordinating with all sectors within the Agency, uses the following four principles as a basis for taking positions on legislation, regulations, and funding opportunities.

- 1. Principle of Water Supply Reliability
- 2. Principle of Water-Energy Nexus
- 3. Principle of Clean and Safe Drinking Water
- 4. Principle of Responsive and Responsible Finance, Administration, and Operations



Policy Goal

Maintain and protect the reliability and cost-effectiveness of local and imported sources of water. Advocate for groundwater storage, recovery, and management, brackish desalination, wastewater treatment, recycled water, and conservation as effective and efficient drought response efforts.



Water Supply & Storage

- 1. Support local water supply, storage, and recovery projects that ensure future reliability, increase local flexibility, reduce reliance on imported water and oppose efforts that constrain these opportunities.
- 2. Support administrative and legislative actions that promote resiliency, improved operability of IEUA and regional systems, and respond to and plan for drought conditions while maintaining the necessary environmental protections.
- 3. Support administrative, legislative, and funding opportunities to ensure the reliability of imported water supplies including, but not limited to, conveyance and storage projects, salinity control measures, and cleanup for contaminated sites.
- 4. Support funding opportunities for local water supply development and water quality improvement projects benefiting IEUA's Region, IEUA customer agencies, the Chino Basin, and the Santa Ana Watershed.
- 5. Support funding for drought relief and adaptive water management opportunities in California that promote sustainability and reliability.
- 6. Support administrative and legislative actions that facilitate the adoption of practical uniform water recycling criteria and expanded application for direct and indirect potable reuse.

Water Use Efficiency & Shortage Response

- 1. Support a definition of "efficient use of water" that includes local hydrologic conditions and protects trees and healthy soils that also minimizes the impacts on wastewater flows and treatment operations.
- 2. Support conservation actions and efforts during declared water shortage emergencies that reduce outdoor use of potable water while protecting trees and healthy soils.
- 3. Support administrative and legislative actions that recognize local hydrologic conditions and local/regional efforts in meeting statutory Urban Water Use Objectives or other water-use efficiency goals.
- 4. Support funding opportunities and incentive programs that promote water-use efficiency and permanent water-use restrictions including, but not limited to turf transformation, tax exemptions, and technical assistance.

Promote science-based, environmentally sustainable practices that respond to climate change, ensure water resilience, and promote emissions reductions and renewable energy.


Energy Supply and Reliability

- 1. Support diverse energy supply options and oppose constraints on energy supply development.
- 2. Support actions and investments in renewable energy to reduce reliance on grid power, increase energy reliability, and reduce overall energy costs.
- 3. Support voluntary investment in wildfire system hardening and efforts to insulate IEUA from Public Safety Power Shutoffs.
- 4. Support actions that would increase the value of Renewable Energy Credits (RECs) generated and sold by wastewater treatment agencies that utilize on-site renewable energy.
- 5. Support legislation, regulations, and administrative policies that ensure that power costs reflect the cost of energy procurement, infrastructure, and maintenance.

Water Quality

- Support reasonable and scientifically significant administrative and legislative actions that promote and/or improve source water quality and regulate constituents of emerging concern that consider factors such as stakeholder input, feasibility, laboratory capacity, analytical methods, and implementation costs.
- 2. Support legislative and administrative approaches promoting "polluter pays" principles, extending responsibility for contamination to chemical manufacturers and promoting consumer product responsibility.
- 3. Support actions and investments to help public water systems defray the costs of monitoring and/or remediation of per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances and ensure drinking water and wastewater facilities are not held liable for the cleanup of contamination.

Administrative Processes

- 1. Support efforts that align with IEUA's commitment to applying the highest standards of fiscal responsibility, integrity, ethical, and transparent business practices and principles.

Financial

Executive Summary:

Regional Water Recycling Plant No.1 (RP-1) uses four bar screens with a spacing of 5/8-inch to remove material and debris in the influent headworks process. Staff has observed more issues downstream such as mixers seizing and pumps plugging, resulting in process interruptions, equipment downtime, and additional maintenance costs. This project will install IEUA's new standard multi-rake bar screens which have a 3/8-inch spacing that are estimated to increase the capture rate more than 40% which will reduce operating and maintenance costs.

On August 24, 2022, Inland Empire Utilities Agency (IEUA) pre-qualified four design-build teams to bid on the project. The design-build team will prepare and complete design drawings, specifications, process control narratives, construction, commissioning, startup, testing, and training for the new bar screens.

On November 3, 2022, IEUA issued an invitation for bids to the four pre-qualified design-build teams. On December 20, 2022, IEUA received four construction bids. GSE Construction Co., Inc. was deemed the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, with a bid price of \$1,609,900. The engineer's estimate was \$1,700,000.

Staff's Recommendation:

- 1. Award a design-build contract for the RP-1 Headworks Bar Screen System Improvements, Project No. EN23111, to GSE Construction Co., Inc. in the amount of \$1,609,900; and
- 2. Authorize the General Manager to execute the contract, subject to non-substantive changes.

THIS CONTRACT, made and entered into this <u>15</u> day of <u>February</u>, 20<u>23</u>, by and between <u>GSE Construction Company Inc.</u>, hereinafter referred to as "DESIGN BUILD ENTITY," and The Inland Empire Utilities Agency, a Municipal Water District, located in San Bernardino County, California, hereinafter referred to as "IEUA".

WITNESSETH:

That for and in consideration of the promises and agreements hereinafter made and exchanged, IEUA and the DESIGN BUILD ENTITY agree as follows:

- If this is not a lump sum bid and the Contract Price is dependent upon the quantities constructed, IEUA will pay and said DESIGN BUILD ENTITY shall receive, in full compensation for the Work the prices named in the Bidding and Contract Requirements, Section C BID FORMS.
- D. IEUA hereby employs the DESIGN BUILD ENTITY to perform the Work according to the terms of this Contract for the above-mentioned price(s), and agrees to pay the same at the time, in the manner, and upon the conditions stipulated in the said Bid Documents; and the said parties for themselves, their heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, do hereby agree to the full performance of the covenants herein contained.
- E. The Notice Inviting Bids, Instructions to Bidders, Bid Forms, Information Required of Bidder, Performance Bond, Payment Bond, DESIGN BUILD ENTITY's License Declaration, Specifications, Drawings, all General Conditions, Special Conditions and all Project Requirements, and all Addenda issued by IEUA with respect to the foregoing prior to the opening of bids, are hereby incorporated in and made part of this Contract, as if fully set forth.
- F. The DESIGN BUILD ENTITY agrees to commence Work under this Contract on or before the date to be specified in a written "Notice To Proceed" and to complete said Work to the satisfaction of IEUA five hundred (500) calendar days after Award of the Contract. All Work shall be completed before final payment is made.
- **G.** Time is of the essence on this Contract.
- **H.** DESIGN BUILD ENTITY agrees that in case the Work is not completed before or upon the expiration of the Contract Time, damage will be sustained by IEUA, and that it is and will be impracticable to determine the actual damage which IEUA will sustain in the event and by reason of such delay, and it is therefore agreed that the DESIGN BUILD ENTITY shall pay to IEUA the amounts as set forth in General Conditions, Section C -CHANGES TO THE CONTRACT for each day of delay, which shall be the period between the expiration of the Contract Time and the date of final acceptance by IEUA, as liquidated damages and not as a penalty. It is further agreed that the amount stipulated for liquidated damages per day of delay is a reasonable estimate of the damages that would be sustained by IEUA, and the DESIGN BUILD ENTITY agrees to pay such liquidated damages as herein provided. In case the liquidated damages are not paid, the DESIGN BUILD ENTITY agrees that IEUA may deduct the amount thereof from any money due or that may become due to the DESIGN BUILD ENTITY by progress payments or otherwise under the Contract, or if said amount is not sufficient, recover the total amount.

- In addition to the liquidated damages, which may be imposed if the DESIGN BUILD ENTITY fails to complete the Work within the time agreed upon, IEUA may also deduct from any sums due or to become due to the DESIGN BUILD ENTITY, penalties and fines for violations of applicable local, state, and federal law.
- **J.** That the DESIGN BUILD ENTITY shall carry Workers' Compensation Insurance and require all subcontractors to carry Workers' Compensation Insurance as required by the California Labor Code.
- K. That the DESIGN BUILD ENTITY shall have furnished, prior to execution of the Contract, two bonds approved by IEUA, one in the amount of one hundred (100) percent of the Contract Price, to guarantee the faithful performance of the Work, and one in the amount of one hundred (100) percent of the Contract Price to guarantee payment of all claims for labor and materials furnished.

The DESIGN BUILD ENTITY hereby agrees to protect, defend, indemnify and hold IEUA and its employees, Engineers, agents, officers, directors, servants and volunteers free and harmless from any and all liability, claims, judgments, costs and demands, including demands arising from injuries or death of persons (including employees of IEUA and the DESIGN BUILD ENTITY) and damage to property, arising directly or indirectly out of the obligation herein undertaken or out of the operations conducted by the DESIGN BUILD ENTITY, its employees agents, representatives or subcontractors under or in connection with this Contract to the fullest extent permitted by law.

The DESIGN BUILD ENTITY further agrees to investigate, handle, respond to, provide defense for and defend any such claims, demands or suit at the sole expense of the DESIGN BUILD ENTITY

Executive Summary:

The Board of Directors conducted the annual General Manager performance review in closed session on January 18, 2023. The review was originally scheduled for September 18, 2022. Based upon the review, the Board recommended two items for consideration and action in open session.

The first item is consideration of a performance award based upon completion of stated goals and objectives over the last year. The current employment agreement allows for a performance award of up to 10% of base salary. The base salary applicable here is \$311,428.

Secondly, based upon the General Manager's positive performance review, and a compensation survey of comparable agencies, the Board determined that an amendment to the General Manager's employment agreement should be considered. The Restated Employment Agreement submitted herewith provides an increase in base salary to \$340,000 per year and an increase in employer contribution to the 457(b) deferred compensation plan to \$576.92 per pay period. All other agreement terms would remain the same.

- 1. Consider and approve a General Manager's performance award in an amount not to exceed 10% of base salary; and
- 2. Consider and approve the Restated Employment Agreement submitted herewith.

RESTATED EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT

THIS RESTATED EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT, effective as of February 15, 2023, is by and between INLAND EMPIRE UTILITIES AGENCY a Municipal Water District organized and operating pursuant to California Water Code Section 71000 et seq. ("Employer"), and SHIVAJI DESHMUKH an individual ("Employee"). Employer and Employee agree to the following terms and conditions of employment:

WHEREAS, The Parties have previously entered into a First Amended Employment Agreement effective May 22, 2019; and

WHEREAS, on February 16, 2022, the Parties agreed to extend the term of the First Amended Employment Agreement to June 30, 2027; and

WHEREAS, certain changes to the Employment Agreement are deemed necessary to bring that agreement into conformity with other executive management employment agreements currently in effect at the Agency (Employer);

NOW THEREFORE the Parties agree as follows:

1. Period of Employment.

- (a) <u>Basic Term</u>. Commencing on February 15, 2023 and continuing until June 30, 2027, (the "Term Date"), Employer shall employ Employee as the General Manager. The Term Date may be extended under Section 1 (b), unless the employment is terminated sooner in accordance with Section 5 below. As used herein, the phrase "Employment Term" shall refer to the entire period of employment of Employee by Employer hereunder, whether for the periods mentioned above or whether extended or earlier terminated as hereinafter provided.
- (b) <u>Renewal.</u> This Agreement shall be automatically renewed for an additional one (1) year period on the Term Date and on each anniversary thereof, unless one party gives to the other advance written notice of non-renewal at least sixty (60) days prior to such date. Either party may elect not to renew this Agreement with or without cause, in which case this Section 1 (b) shall govern Employee's termination and not Section 5 [except for Employee's termination obligations set forth in Section 5(g), which shall remain in effect).

2. <u>Duties and Responsibilities.</u>

(a) <u>Position</u>. Employee shall serve as the General Manager for the Employer. In that capacity, Employee shall perform all services, acts, and functions necessary and proper to lawfully manage and conduct the business of Employer in accordance with all legal requirements and the policies, procedures, rules, and regulations established by Employer's Board of Directors ("the Board"), and subject to the direction, prior consent, and subsequent ratification of the Board. Employee's duties shall include, but shall not be limited to, supervising Employer's personnel and financial matters, attending meetings of the Board and its Committees, supervising the administration of all operations of Employer, subject

to policies set by the Board, and managing and conducting all the business of Employer. In addition, Employee shall report directly to the Board and shall perform any special duties assigned or delegated to him by the Board.

- (b) Availability and Work Schedule. In order that nothing interfere with the performance of Employee's duties under this Agreement or create any conflicts of interest during his employment, Employee shall devote his full energies, interest, abilities, and productive time to the satisfactory performance of this Agreement and shall not engage in any other activities except as otherwise approved by the Board. During the Employment Term, Employee shall perform all services required by this Agreement at Employer's headquarters during Employer's regular business hours, unless Employee's presence at other locations or during different times is necessary to fully and completely perform the duties of the position assumed by Employee.
- (c) <u>Prohibited Activities.</u> Except upon the prior written consent and express approval of the Board, Employee (during the Employment Term) shall not (i) borrow on behalf of Employer any amount of money during any fiscal year; (ii) spend or obligate Employer's funds in amounts in excess of the sums budgeted for expenditure by the Board; (iii) accept any other employment; (iv) engage directly or indirectly in any other business, commercial, civil, or professional activity, whether or not pursued for pecuniary advantage, that is or may be competitive with Employer, that might create a conflict of interest with Employer, or that otherwise might interfere with the business of Employer or any Affiliate of Employer; or (v) accept any position with an outside agency without prior approval of the Board. An "Affiliate" shall mean any person or entity that directly or indirectly controls, is controlled by or is under common control with Employer.
- (d) <u>Representations.</u> Employee represents and warrants (i) that he is fully qualified and competent to perform the responsibilities for which he is being hired pursuant to the terms of this Agreement; and (ii) that Employee's execution of this Agreement, his employment with Employer, and the performance of his proposed duties under this Agreement shall not violate any obligation he may have to any former employer (or other person or entity), including any obligations with respect to proprietary or confidential information of any person or entity.

3. <u>Compensation.</u>

(a) <u>Base Salary</u>. Employer shall pay Employee a Base Salary at the rate of \$340,000.00 per year during the Employment Term in accordance with Employer's duly established practices. For purposes of this Agreement, the term "Base Salary" shall be defined as Employee's annual gross compensation, exclusive of the cost of any insurance or other benefits made available to Employee. Base Salary shall be payable to Employee in installments consistent with Employer's regular pay period cycles and subject to appropriate withholdings. Employer may, but is not obligated to, increase Employee's Base Salary as deemed appropriate by the Board in the exercise of its sole discretion upon completion of its annual review of Employee's job performance.

- (b) <u>Cost of Living Adjustment.</u> Employee shall be entitled to cost of living increases commensurate with those cost of living increases extended to other executive management employees.
- (c) <u>Performance Award.</u> During the Employment Term, Employer, in the exercise of its discretion, may also pay Employee a Performance Award in addition to Base Salary for successful completion of goals and objectives established by the Board. For purposes of this Agreement, the term "Performance Award" shall be defined as meritorious compensation, subject to appropriate withholdings, not included in the calculation of Base Salary. The maximum amount of any Performance Award that Employee may receive under this Agreement shall be ten percent (10%) of Base Salary.
- (d) <u>Automobile Allowance</u>. During the Employment Term, Employer shall provide Employee an automobile allowance of \$700.00 per month for use of Employee's personal vehicle on Employer's business. The automobile allowance includes full compensation for all costs, depreciation, operation, maintenance and repairs, insurance, gasoline, tires and oil, and all other incidental expenses associated with the operation of Employee's personal automobile on Employer's business.
- (e) Benefits. During the Employment Term, Employee shall be entitled to receive those benefits provided by Employer to its executive management employees in accordance with Employer's standard policies. As Employee becomes eligible therefor, Employee shall have the right to participate in and to receive benefits from all present and future benefit plans specified in Employer's policies and generally made available to similarly situated employees of Employer. Medical benefits shall be made available to Employee and his dependents in an amount equal to the cost of the most generous family coverage premium available through the Public Employment Retirement System (PERS). Employer will pay the monthly premium on the medical and dental benefit provided by Employer to Employee. Employee may exercise the option to accept 100% of the value of the health benefits described herein as cash in lieu of coverage, however, Employee must provide Employer with proof of health coverage through an alternative provider. Commencing on the month following retirement, whereupon Employee receives a retirement allowance from PERS, Employer shall provide Employee and his dependents medical, dental and vision, and other Employer provided insurance coverage, to the extent that it is provided to other executive management employees. Employee also shall be entitled to any benefits or compensation tied to termination as described in Section 5 below. All compensation and comparable payments to be paid to Employee under this Agreement shall be less withholdings required by law.
- (f) <u>Supplemental Insurance</u>. Employee shall receive term life insurance coverage from Employer 1x employee's annual salary up to \$300,000 during the Employment Term. Employee shall cooperate with Employer if Employer seeks to obtain "key employee" insurance coverage on Employee for the benefit of Employer.
- (g) <u>Vacation</u>. Subject to paragraph 4b of this Agreement, Employee shall be entitled to one hundred sixty (160) hours of vacation time each employment anniversary year during the Employment Term without loss of compensation, eighty (80) hours of which shall be credited to Employee's account immediately upon execution of this Agreement and the remainder of which shall accrue in the same manner as otherwise applicable to executive management employees of Employer. Upon termination of employment, Employee shall be entitled to

- payment of all accrued but unused vacation leave at the rate of compensation in effect at the time of termination in conformance with Employer's then-current policy.
- (h) <u>Sick Leave</u>. Subject to paragraph 4b of this Agreement, Employee shall be entitled to accrue sick leave each year during the Employment Term without loss of compensation, in an amount commensurate with executive management employees. Upon termination of employment, Employee shall be entitled to payment of all accrued but unused sick leave at the rate of compensation in effect at the time of termination in conformance with Employer's thencurrent policy including, but not limited to, policies limiting the accrual of sick leave.
- (i) Executive Leave. Subject to paragraph 4b of this Agreement, Employee shall be entitled to eighty (80) hours of executive leave each fiscal year during the Employment Term without loss of compensation, all of which shall be credited to Employee's account immediately upon execution and again on the first day of July of each year during the Employment Term. Executive leave shall accrue in the same manner as otherwise applicable to executive management employees of Employer.
- (j) <u>Professional Development.</u> Employer shall pay for travel and subsistence expenses of Employee for professional and office meetings, conferences, workshops and occasions adequate to continue the professional development of Employee and to adequately pursue necessary official functions for Employer. All such expenditures shall be in conformity with the applicable policies and procedures of Employer.
- (k) <u>General Expenditures</u>. Employer recognizes that certain expenses of non-personal and job affiliated nature are incurred by Employee in conjunction with his responsibilities hereunder and shall reimburse or pay said general expenses in accordance with existing Employer policy for other executive management employees
- (l) <u>Deferred Compensation.</u> Beginning with the pay period starting on February 19, 2023, and during the Employment Term (or if earlier, through the date Employee's employment with Employer terminates), Employer shall contribute \$576.92 per pay period to Employee's account under Employer's 457(b) deferred compensation plan. If Employee's employment terminates during a pay period, the Employer contribution for that pay period will be prorated accordingly. Additionally, the contributions will be pre-tax except to the extent (i) Employee directs the contribution be made as a Roth contribution (an option that applies only if permitted under the 457(b) plan's terms), or (ii) the tax laws mandate that the contribution be made as a Roth contribution. Employee acknowledges and understands that any Roth contributions made by the Employer to Employee's 457(b) account will be after-tax and, as such, subject to applicable tax withholdings. Finally, Employer contributions will be made only to the extent permitted under the contribution limits imposed by the tax laws.

4. Other Terms and Conditions of Employment.

(a) <u>Automobile Insurance.</u> Employee shall, at his sole expense, acquire and maintain in effect always during the term of this Agreement automobile insurance, in a form acceptable to the Board, covering all motor vehicles operated by Employee while on Employer's business and providing liability limits for bodily injury and property damage of not less than \$500,000, and uninsured and underinsured motorist coverage of at least \$500,000,

combined single limit per occurrence. Employer and its officers, directors, and employees shall be expressly covered as additional insureds on all insurance required under this Agreement, and endorsements evidencing such coverage shall be provided to the Board. On June 30 of each year Employee shall provide the Board with certificate(s) of insurance which reflect(s) the coverages required under this Agreement, in a form acceptable to the Board, and signed by the insurer(s) or an authorized representative. The said certificate(s)shall contain a stipulation that none of the coverages required under this Agreement will be canceled, modified, non-renewed, or suffer any changes in conditions except after at least thirty (30) days prior written notice to the Board. All insurers providing the coverages required under this Paragraph shall be admitted, domestic carriers with all evidences of coverages countersigned by authorized representatives properly licensed in the State of California. Said insurers must also possess at least an "A: XIII" policyholder's rating in accordance with the current Best's Key Rating Guide or equivalent.

- (b) Employer Reservation. Employer shall fix any such other terms and conditions of employment, as it may determine from time to time, relating to the performance of Employee, provided such terms and conditions are not inconsistent with or in conflict with the provisions of this Agreement or applicable law. Except as herein provided, all other requirements of the ordinances, resolutions, and regulations and rules of Employer relating to vacation and sick leave, retirement and pension system contributions, holidays, and other fringe benefits and working conditions, as they now exist or hereafter may be amended, also shall apply to Employee as they would to other employees of Employer, in addition to said benefits enumerated specifically herein.
- (c) <u>Evaluation of Performance</u>. Employer shall evaluate the performance of Employee not less than every twelve months, or more often at the Employer's discretion. Such written and/or oral evaluations shall be used as a basis for determining in the exercise of the Employer's sole discretion any adjustments to compensation and/or benefits to which Employee may be entitled.
- (d) <u>Personnel Manual.</u> Subject to paragraph 4b of this Agreement, all provisions, terms and conditions of the Executive Management Employees Personnel Manual not in conflict with the terms of this Agreement shall apply. To the extent such a conflict occurs, this Agreement shall be controlling.
- (e) <u>Classification</u>. The position of General Manager shall be deemed a separate classification of employee.

5. Termination of Employment.

(a) <u>By Death.</u> The Employment Term shall terminate automatically upon the death of Employee. Employer shall pay to Employee's beneficiaries or estate as appropriate any compensation then due and owing, including payment for accrued, unused paid time off, if any. Thereafter, all obligations of Employer under this Agreement shall cease. Nothing in this section shall affect any entitlement or Employee's heirs to the benefits of any life insurance plan or other applicable benefits.

- (b) <u>By Disability</u>. If because of any physical or mental incapacity, Employee has been or will be prevented from properly performing his duties under this Agreement for more than six (6) consecutive months, then to the extent permitted by law, the Board may terminate the Employment Term, pursuant to Section 5(c), below, upon two (2) weeks advance written notice. Employer shall pay Employee all compensation to which he is entitled up through the last business day of the notice period and a lump sum cash payment equal to three (3) months base salary; thereafter, all obligations of Employer under this Agreement shall cease. Nothing in this Section shall affect Employee's rights under any applicable Employer disability plan.
- (c) By Employer for Cause. At any time, and without prior notice, the Employer may terminate Employee for cause (as defined below). Employer shall pay Employee all compensation then due and owing for the period prior to termination, thereafter all of Employer's obligations under this Agreement shall cease. "Cause" shall include, but not be limited to, unsatisfactory performance, misconduct, moral turpitude, failure to follow policies or procedures, material breach of this Agreement, excessive absenteeism, unlawful conduct on or off the Employer's premises or during working or non-working time (which may affect the Employee's relationship to his job and/or the Employer's reputation or good will in the community), layoff pursuant to a bona fide reduction in force, and to the extent permitted by law, unavailability for work due to disability for more than six (6) consecutive months.
- (d) <u>By Employer Not for Cause.</u> Notwithstanding paragraph 5 (c), Employee is deemed an "at will" employee and the Board may dismiss Employee without cause by a majority vote notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in or arising from any statements, policies, or practices of Employer relating to the employment, discipline, or termination of its employees. If such termination occurs, Employer shall pay Employee all compensation then due and owing for the period prior to termination, plus a lump sum cash payment equal to three (6) months Employee's base salary and thereafter all of Employer's obligations under this Agreement shall cease.
- (e) <u>By Employee Not for Cause.</u> At any time, Employee may terminate his employment for any reason, with or without cause, by providing Employer ninety (90) days advance written notice. The Board shall have the option in its complete discretion to make Employee's termination effective at any time prior to the end of such notice period, provided Employer pays Employee all compensation due and owing through the last day worked, plus an amount equal to the base salary Employee would have earned through the balance of the notice period, not to exceed ninety (90) days; thereafter, all of Employer's obligations under this Agreement shall cease.
- (f) By Employee for Good Reason. At any time, Employee may terminate his employment for good reason (as defined below) by giving ninety (90) days advance written notice to Employer. "Good Reason" shall be any material breach of this Agreement by Employer that remains uncured at the end of the above notice period. The Board shall have the option in its complete discretion to make Employee's termination effective at any time prior to the end of the above notice period, provided Employer pays Employee all compensation due and owing through the last day worked and through the balance of the notice period not to exceed ninety (90) days. If Good Reason is found to exist pursuant

to Section 7 of this Agreement, the maximum amount that Employer shall be liable to Employee therefore shall be a monetary sum equal to Employee's base salary prorated over the remaining balance of the unexpired Employment Term, or over a period of six (6) months, whichever is less, which shall be in lieu of any damages under this Agreement for any alleged breach. Thereafter, all of Employer's obligations under this Agreement shall cease.

- (g) <u>Termination Obligations</u>. Employee agrees that all property, including without limitation all equipment, tangible Proprietary Information (as defined below), documents, records, notes, contracts, and computer-generated materials furnished to or prepared by Employee incident to his employment belongs to Employer and shall be returned promptly to Employer upon termination of Employee's employment. Employee's obligations under this subsection shall survive the termination of his employment and the expiration of this Agreement.
- (h) Proprietary Information. "Proprietary Information" is all information and any idea pertaining in any manner to the business of Employer (or any Affiliate), its employees, agents, contractors, or consultants, which was produced by any employee of Employer during his employment or otherwise produced or acquired by or on behalf of Employer. Proprietary Information shall include without limitation, trade secrets, protocol ideas, inventions, processes, formulas, data, know-how, software and other computer programs, copyrightable material, plans, strategies, customer lists and information, financial reports, and the contents of documents protected from disclosure under the California Public Records Act, Government Code Section 6250 et seq., or other provisions of applicable law. All Proprietary Information not generally known outside of Employer's organization, and all Proprietary Information so known only through improper means, shall be deemed "Confidential Information." During his employment by Employer, Employee shall use Proprietary Information and shall disclose Confidential Information only for the benefit of Employer and as is necessary to perform his job responsibilities under this Agreement. Following any termination of employment, Employee shall not use any Proprietary Information and shall not disclose any Confidential Information except with the express written consent of Employer.

6. <u>Arbitration.</u>

(a) Arbitrable Claims. All disputes between Employee (his attorneys, successors, and assigns) and Employer (its Affiliates, shareholders, directors, officers, employees, agents, successors, attorneys, and assigns) of any kind whatsoever, including without limitation all disputes relating in any manner to the employment or termination of employee and all disputes arising under this Agreement ("Arbitrable Claims"), shall be resolved by arbitration. All persons and entities specified in the preceding sentence (other than Employer and Employee) shall be considered third-party beneficiaries of the rights and obligations created by this Section. Arbitrable Claims shall include but are not limited to contract (express or implied) and tort claims of all kinds, as well as all claims based on any federal, state, or local law, statute, or regulation, excepting only claims under applicable worker's compensation law and unemployment insurance claims. Arbitration shall be final and binding upon the parties and shall be the exclusive remedy for all Arbitrable Claims. THE PARTIES HEREBY WAIVE ANY RIGHTS THEY MAY HAVE TO TRIAL BY JURY

REGARDING ARBITRABLE CLAIMS.

- (b) <u>Procedure.</u> Arbitration of Arbitrable Claims shall be in accordance with the Employment Dispute Resolution Rules of the American Arbitration Association ("AAA Employment Rules") which can be found at https://www.adr.org except as provided otherwise in this Agreement. In any arbitration, the burden of proof shall be allocated as provided by applicable law. Either party may bring an action in court to compel arbitration under this Agreement and to enforce an arbitration award. Otherwise, neither party shall initiate or prosecute any lawsuit or administrative action in any way related to any Arbitrable Claim. All arbitration hearings under this Agreement shall be conducted in San Bernardino County, California. The Federal Arbitration Act shall govern the interpretation and enforcement of this Section 6. The fees of the arbitrator shall be borne by Employer.
- (c) <u>Confidentiality.</u> All proceedings and all documents prepared about any arbitrable claim shall be confidential and unless otherwise required by law, the subject matter thereof shall not be disclosed to any person other than the parties to the proceedings, their counsel, witnesses, and experts, the arbitrator and if involved, the court and court staff.
- (d) <u>Continuing Obligations</u>. The rights and obligations of Employee and Employer set forth in Section 6 of this Agreement shall survive the termination of Employee's employment and the expiration of the Employment Term.

7. Notices.

Any notice under this Agreement must be in writing and shall be effective upon delivery by hand, upon facsimile transmission to the number provided below (if one is provided), or three (3) business days after deposit in the United States mail, postage prepaid, certified or registered and addressed to Employer at the address below or to Employee at the last known address maintained in Employee's personnel file. Employee shall be obligated to notify Employer in writing of any change in his address. Notice of change of address shall be effective only when done in accordance with this Section.

8. Action by Employer.

All actions required or permitted to be taken under this Agreement by Employer, including without limitation, exercise of discretion, consents, waivers, and amendments to this Agreement, shall be made and authorized only by the Board of Directors. The failure of Employer to insist on strict compliance with any of the terms, covenants, or conditions of this Agreement by Employee shall not be deemed a waiver of that term, covenant, or condition, nor shall any waiver or relinquishment of any right or power at any one time or times be deemed a waiver or relinquishment of that right or power for all or any other times.

9. Integration.

This Agreement is intended to be the final, complete, and exclusive statement of the terms of Employee's employment by Employer. This Agreement supersedes all other prior and contemporaneous agreements and statements, whether written or oral, express or implied, pertaining in any manner to the employment of Employee by Employer, and it may not be contradicted by evidence of any prior or contemporaneous statement or agreements. To the extent that the practices, policies, or procedures of Employer now or in the future, apply to Employee and are inconsistent with the terms of this Agreement, the provisions of this Agreement shall control.

10. Amendments.

This Agreement may not be modified or amended except by a writing signed by each of the parties hereto. Failure to exercise any right under this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of such right.

11. Assignment.

Neither party shall assign any rights or obligations under this Agreement.

12. Severability.

If a court or arbitrator holds any provision of this Agreement to be invalid, unenforceable, or void, the remainder of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

13. Attorneys' Fees.

In any legal action, arbitration, or other proceeding brought to enforce or interpret the terms of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover reasonable attorneys' fees and costs.

14. Governing Law.

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the law of the State of California.

15. <u>Interpretation.</u>

The captions or sections and subsections of this Agreement are for reference only and are not to be construed in any way as a part of this Agreement.



118th Congress Begins; McCarthy Elected Speaker of the House

On January $3^{\rm rd}$, Congress officially began the $118^{\rm th}$ Congress. Senators were sworn in and immediately adjourned for a two-week recess. In the House of Representatives, the swearing in of Members was delayed for a few days as the first action the House needed to take was to elect a new Speaker. After five days and fifteen votes, Rep. Kevin McCarthy (R-CA) was elected to be the new Speaker of the House.

President Biden to Deliver State of the Union on February 7th

During the first three months of the new year, the Speaker of the House invites the President to Congress to provide a State of the Union speech. Speaker Kevin McCarthy has formally invited President Biden to give the State of the Union address to a joint session of Congress on Tuesday, February 7^{th} at 9:00 pm ET.

Congressional and Federal Action Related to California Storms

Federal Disaster Declaration Declared Due to California Storms. On January 14th, President Biden signed the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) major disaster declaration for California in the wake of devastating storms over the past month. Assistance can include grants for temporary housing and home repairs, low-cost loans to cover uninsured property losses, and other programs to help individuals and business owners recover from the effects of the disaster. Federal funding for the approved cost-share programs will be made available at 100 percent of the total eligible costs for debris removal and emergency protective measures, including direct federal assistance under the Public Assistance program, for 60 days from the start of the incident period. More information on the federal response to storm damage in California can be found **HERE**.

IRS Announces 30 Day Extension for Federal Filings for Impacted Counties. The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) announced that California storm victims now have until May 15, 2023, to file various federal individual and business tax returns and make tax payments. The IRS is offering relief to any area designated by FEMA. This means that individuals and households that reside or have a business in Alameda, Colusa, Contra Costa, El Dorado,

Fresno, Glenn, Humboldt, Kings, Lake, Los Angeles, Madera, Marin, Mariposa, Mendocino, Merced, Mono, Monterey, Napa, Orange, Placer, Riverside, Sacramento, San Benito, San Bernardino, San Diego, San Francisco, San Joaquin, San Luis Obispo, San Mateo, Santa Barbara, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, Solano, Sonoma, Stanislaus, Sutter, Tehama, Tulare, Ventura, Yolo and Yuba counties qualify for tax relief. More information can be found HERE.

California Republicans Request Waiver to Pumping Restriction and Prioritization of Water Storage. Rep. David Valadao (R-CA) led a group of California Republicans in a letter to President Biden and California Governor Gavin Newsom urging them to waive impediments to Delta pump operations to ensure the current storm flows in California are utilized. The lawmakers also urged President Biden and Governor Newsom to prioritize and expedite water storage projects to help the state better prepare for future storm events. The letter can be found HERE.

Rep. Costa Urges Maximum Pumping and Conservation of Surface Water. Rep. Jim Costa (D-CA) sent a letter to Governor Newsom, Interior Secretary Deb Haaland, and California Secretary of the Natural Resources Agency Wade Crowfoot to advocate for the maximum conservation of available surface water in the wake of recent storms, including pumping at the southern Delta Central Valley Project and State Water Project pumping plants. California Members Call for Public Hearings on Delta Tunnel Report

California Democratic Representatives Josh Harder, Mike Thompson, Mark DeSaulnier, and John Garamendi sent a letter to Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) Lieutenant General Scott Spellman calling for a reversal of the decision not to hold public hearings on the proposed Delta Tunnel project and extend the public comment period by an additional 60 days. The current Environmental Impact Statement for the project is open for public comment until February 14th. The letter can be found HERE.

President Biden FY24 Budget Proposal Delayed

The President's annual budget proposal is supposed to be due to Congress on the first Monday in February; however, this is a deadline that is regularly missed. At the end of January, the Office of Management provided guidance to the federal agencies regarding the upcoming release of the President's Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 budget. Typically, there is about a six-week period between when OMB provides this guidance to the agencies and when the official budget document is released, setting up a potential timetable for the FY24 budget proposal to be out in mid-to-late March.

Treasury Outlines "Extraordinary Measures" to Prevent Debt Default

Department of Treasury (Treasury) Secretary Janet Yellen announced the implementation of "extraordinary measures" to extend the time when the United States from exceeding the current debt ceiling. Congress must raise the debt ceiling to prevent the United States from defaulting on debt payments. Secretary Yellen sent a letter to Congressional leadership

outlining steps Treasury will take to push the potential for default to June and urging action to "protect the full faith and credit of the United States." The letter can be found **HERE**.

Final WOTUS Rule Officially Released

At the end of December, the Environmental Protection Agency and the Army Corps of Engineers announced the pre-publication notice for the Waters of the United States (WOTUS) final rule. The WOTUS rule defines the scope of federal jurisdiction over waters and wetlands under the jurisdiction of the Clean Water Act. On January 18th, the rule was officially published in the Federal Register. This action means that the rule now has an effective date of March 20th. Federal Funding Opportunities/Announcements

DOE Announces \$50 Million Clean Energy to Communities Program. The Department of Energy (DOE) announced the availability of \$50 million in grant funding for its new Clean Energy to Communities (C2C) Program. C2C will connect local governments, electric utilities, community-based groups, and others with the innovative modeling and testing tools developed at DOE's national laboratories to further expand clean energy goals and programs at the local level. The application is expected to open in mid-February, and more information can be found **HERE**.

EPA Announces Availability of \$100 Million in IRA EJ Grants. The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) announced the availability of \$100 million in environmental justice (EJ) grants through two programs:

- Environmental Justice Collaborative Problem-Solving (EJCPS) Cooperative Agreement Program. This program will provide an estimated \$30 million in funding directly to community-based nonprofit organizations and their partners, with \$5 million reserved for small community-based nonprofit organizations with five or fewer full-time employees. EPA anticipates funding 50 awards of \$500,000 and 30 awards of \$150,000. More information on the program can be found HERE.
- Environmental Justice Government-to-Government (EJG2G) Program. This program will provide \$70 million in funding. \$20 million of the total funding for this program will be for local government. EPA anticipates funding 70 projects of up to \$1 million each for a 3-year project. More information on the program can be found HERE.

EPA Announces Availability of \$50 Million in BIL Funding for Carbon Sequestration and Groundwater Protection. EPA announced the availability of \$50 million in Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) grant funding to help states, tribes, and territories develop and implement Underground Injection Control Class VI programs. Under the Safe Drinking Water Act, Class VI programs ensure that groundwater resources are protected while supporting geologic sequestration of carbon dioxide to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Letters of Intent for the program are due by March 20th and more information can be found **HERE**.

Reclamation Announces \$7 Million in BIL Funding for WaterSMART Program. The Bureau of Reclamation awarded \$7 million in BIL funding to 82 small-scale water efficiency projects. These grants will support local community projects, including measuring water flow, automating water delivery, or lining canals. A list of awards can be found **HERE**.

Reclamation Announces \$80 Million in BIL Funding for Environmental Water Resources Program. The Bureau of Reclamation announced the availability of \$80 million for the Environmental Water Resources Program for projects that address water conservation, water management and restoration projects that will result in significant benefits to ecosystem or watershed health. Funding is available for up to \$3 million per project and applicants must complete the project within three years. The total project cost is capped at \$6 million, and the projects must be part of a collaborative process to increase water resource reliability. Applications are due March by $23^{\rm rd}$ and more information can be found **HERE**.

Federal Agency Personnel/Regulatory Announcements

White House Releases Unified Regulatory Agenda. The White House released the latest Unified Regulatory Agenda that outlines regulatory actions federal agencies are considering in the next six months. The Unified Regulatory Agenda which is released twice a year and can be found HERE.

White House Announces New Deputy National Climate Advisor. The White House announced that Mary Frances Repko will serve as Deputy National Climate Advisor and Deputy Assistant to the President. Repko previously served as Majority Staff Director of the Senate Environment and Public Works Committee.

White House Releases Strategy to Develop Statistics for Environmental-Economic Decisions. The White House released a 15-year strategy titled the "National Strategy to Develop Statistics for Environmental-Economic Decisions." The plan will assess the value of natural assets like air and water alongside economic statistics like gross domestic product. The strategy document can be found HERE.

White House Office of Domestic Climate Policy Announces New Hires. The White House Office of Domestic Climate Policy announced that Hannah Safford will serve as Senior Policy Advisor, and Heather Clark will serve as the Director of Building Emissions. Prior to joining the White House, Safford served as associate director for science policy at the Federation of American Scientists, and Clark was previously a manager in RMI's carbon-free buildings program.

CEQ Announces New Director for Drought and Western Resilience. The Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) announced that Kristen Averyt will serve as the new Director for Drought and Western Resilience. Previously, Averyt served as Senior Climate Advisor for the State of Nevada.

CEQ Publishes Guidance on GHG Consideration and Climate Change. CEQ has published interim guidance to assist agencies in analyzing greenhouse gas and climate change effects

of their proposed actions under the National Environmental Policy Act. Comments are due by March 10th and more information can be found **HERE**.

EPA Announces Next TSCA Test Order for PFAS. EPA issued the next Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA) test order requiring testing on per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) under EPA's the <u>National PFAS Testing Strategy</u>. The test is part of EPA's PFAS Strategic Roadmap to confront contamination from PFAS chemicals. More information can be found <u>HERE</u>.

EPA Releases New PFAS Analytic Tool. EPA released a new interactive PFAS Analytic Tool that provides information about PFAS across the country. The PFAS Analytic Tools bring together multiple sources of information in one spot with mapping, charting, and filtering functions, allowing the public to see where testing has been done and what level of detections were measured. The webpage can be found **HERE**.

EPA Announces New Senior Advisor for Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Accessibility. EPA announced that Christopher Carr will serve as the agency's first Senior Advisor for Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Accessibility. Carr was most recently the Chief Diversity Officer at the College of Engineering and Computing at George Mason University.

EPA Announces Appointments to LGAC. EPA announced that fifteen new members will join seven returning members on the Local Government Advisory Committee (LGAC). LGAC provides independent policy advice to the EPA Administrator on a broad range of issues affecting local governments. The list of appointees can be found **HERE**.

EPA Releases Updated Legal Guidance on Cumulative Impacts to Address EJ. EPA released an updated guidance document titled "Cumulative Impacts Addendum to EPA Legal Tools to Advance Environmental Justice (EJ Legal Tools)." The guidance is a collection of legal authorities to identify and address cumulative impacts through a range of actions, including permitting, regulations, and grants to advance EJ priorities. More information can be found **HERE**.

EPA Proposes Adding EJ, Climate Change, and PFAS to National Enforcement and Compliance Initiatives. EPA announced it is seeking public comment on its proposal to address environmental justice, climate change, and PFAS contamination in its National Enforcement and Compliance Initiatives (NECIs). EPA proposes to continue four of the six current national initiatives during the FY 2024-2027 cycle and return two of the current national initiatives to the core enforcement and compliance program. In addition, EPA proposes to address environmental justice concerns in all NECIs, and to add two new NECIs on mitigating climate change and addressing PFAS pollution for the FY 2024-2027 cycle. Comments are due by March 13th and more information can be found **HERE**.

EPA Announces Plans for Wastewater Regulations and Studies. EPA released Effluent Guidelines Program Plan 15 (Plan 15), which focuses on evaluating the extent and nature of both nutrient and PFAS discharges. Plan 15 announces EPA's determination that revised effluent limitations guidelines and pretreatment standards are warranted for reducing PFAS in leachate discharges from landfills. EPA also announced an expansion of the ongoing study of PFAS discharges by textile manufacturers, a new study of publicly owned treatment works

influents, and a new study on concentrated animal feeding operations. Plan 15 can be found **HERE**.

USDA Rural Development, EPA, and HUD to Host Housing Solutions in Rural Recreation Communities Webinar. USDA Rural Development, EPA's Office of Community Revitalization, and HUD are hosting a webinar on February 15th at 2:00 pm ET on housing solutions in gateway communities. RE: January Report

Overview:

Significant storms the first several weeks of January have dramatically shifted the water supply and drought situation throughout the state. The Sierra snowpack is over 200 percent of average and reservoirs are starting to refill after three years of drought. DWR recently announced that it will increase State Water Project Allocations to 30 percent and hopes to further increase allocations after more snow surveys in February.

The State Water Resources Control Board recently released their daft workplan for 2023. They highlight several priority measures including prioritizing processing new water rights applications, holding necessary hearings and developing public benefit contracts needed to support Water Storage Investment Program projects.

The California Air Resources Board has indicated it intends to delay the Advanced Clean Fleets rules for public agencies and local governments because of significant concern that the needed distribution infrastructure upgrades will not be made in time to support the extra demand on the grid.

Members have been introducing bills at a slow rate for the past several weeks, a small preview of the several thousand bills we will see before the February 17 bill introduction deadline. There is already legislation regarding PFAS, drought monitoring, low income water rate assistance and other topics of interest to IEUA. Policy committee hearings will begin in late February, with significant hearings in March and April ahead of the late April policy committee deadline.

All eyes were on the Governor's January 10 budget release. With a projected \$25 billion deficit for FY 23-24, the Governor has decided not to tap into the over \$30 billion in reserves at this time. The significant spending seen in the past few years has come to a halt, with many previously proposed programs being cut or delayed. Recently the Legislative Analyst's Office indicated that if the economy continues to struggle, the state could see an *additional* \$20-40 billion shortfall. Budget committees will start to meet in the coming weeks and months to discuss individual budget items. The May revise will be especially telling this year following a more informed fiscal situation from the first quarter of 2023.




Water Supply Conditions


January storms have drasticly improved the water situation statwide. The statewide snowpack is sitting at 214 percent of average for this time of year and 128 percent of April 1 averages. While the mountains are staying cold and holding the snowpack, significant rain has started to make its way into the state's main storage reserviors. Lake Oroville is sitting at 110 percent of historical average and 63 percent capacity. San Luis Reservoir, the main south-of-Delta storage facility for the State Water Project, is at just 78 percent of average for this time of the year and 57 percent capacity. The two reserviors combined have gained 1.62 million acre-feet of water in storage.

During the peak of the storms in Northern California, the Delta pumps were operating at minimum capacity to accommodiate "first flush," where water is allowed to flow out to the San Francisco Bay, to move sediment and create good habitat for smelt and salmon. Since Jan 25, the pumps have been operating at maximum capacity.

On January 26, the Department of Water Resources announced an increase in State Water Project allocation to 30 percent. The increase is solely based on reservior levels, not on snowpack. After a manual snow survey that helps determine snow water content and the ariel snow survey that looks at higher elevations and can better predict runoff forecast in late February, DWR expects to further increase the SWP allocation. The last time an allocation was above 30 percent was in 2019, and it was 2006 when State Water Contractors received a 100 percent allocation.







SWRCB Releases Draft Strategic Workplan for 2023

The State Water Resources Control Board recently released their <u>draft strategic workplan for 2023</u>. This plan outlines four areas they plan to take action on in 2023:

- Protect public health by ensuring reliable access to safe, affordable drinking water and sanitation.

Advanced Clean Fleets

As previously reported, the CA Air Resources Board's (CARB) Advanced Clean Fleets rule requires state and local governments to purchase 50 percent zero emissions vehicles (ZEVs) as part of truck additions they make between 2024 and 2026, and 100 percent starting in 2027. Because it is becoming increasingly clear that the state's electric utilities are struggling to provide power, distribution infrastructure upgrades and other power supply needs across the state, CARB is proposing to ease the rules for local governments and expects to have a proposal for consideration in the Spring.

Governor Releases January Proposed FY 2023-24 Budget

On January 10, the Governor released his <u>2023-24 proposed Budget</u>. As expected, the Administration is responding to a significant \$22.5 billion shortfall, stemming from significant inflation, and declining personal income tax and capital gains tax revenues. There is minimal new funding for climate programs outside of what was previously appropriated in the last few years and most items in the Climate Change Budget are funding delays or reductions.

The Legislative Analyst Office recently testified at the Senate Budget Committee hearing outlining the Governor's proposed budget, that if the economy continues to decline the deficit increase by an *additional* \$20-40 billion.

In the Governor's press conference talking about the budget, he indicated that he is interested in talking about a potential resources bond. This could be a significant opportunity for water recycling and an increase for water storage funding. Interest in a bond was reiterated by Secretary Crowfoot in a subsequent call. Details of a bond have not yet been discussed.

Over the next several weeks and months, budget sub-commitments will meet to discuss the line items of the budget. After the May Revise, final changes will be made and a budget will be voted on before the June 15 deadline.

Legislative Update

The 2023-24 Legislative session has started in earnest with Legislators back in Sacramento working on their bill packages ahead of the February 17 bill introduction deadline.

Committee assignments for both houses are now out. There is not a strong presence of IEUA delegation members on any water or resources committees again this year. A full roster of committee assignments can be found here for the <u>Senate</u> and <u>Assembly</u>.

Executive Summary:

The Treasurer's Report of Financial Affairs for the month ended December 31, 2022 is submitted in a format consistent with the State requirements.

For the month of December 2022, total cash, investments, and restricted deposits of \$497,330,760 reflects an increase of \$29,494,875 compared to the total of \$467,835,885 reported for November 2022. The increase is primarily attributed to property and redevelopment tax receipts from the San Bernardino County Tax Assessor.

The unrestricted Agency investment portfolio yield in December 2022 was 2.573 percent, an increase of 0.173 percent compared to the November 2022 yield of 2.400 percent. The change in yield is mainly attributed to market conditions and increased earnings yield in managed investment accounts.

Background

Subject: Treasurer's Report of Financial Affairs

The Treasurer's Report of Financial Affairs for the month ended December 31, 2022, is submitted in a format consistent with State requirements. The monthly report denotes investment transactions that have been executed in accordance with the Agency's Investment Policy (Resolution No. 2022-4-8).




Figure 1: Cash, Investments, and Restricted Deposits

Agency total cash, investments, and restricted deposits for the month of December 2022 was \$497.3 million, an increase of \$29.5 million compared to the \$467.8 million reported for the month ended November 2022 as shown in Figure 1. The increase can be primarily attributed to property and redevelopment tax receipts from the San Bernardino County Tax Assessor.

PFM continues to focus on investment discipline and maintaining a neutral duration strategy to ensure current investments align with the Agency's Investment Policy's goals of preservation of capital in the overall portfolio, provide sufficient liquidity to meet to operating requirements, and attain a market rate of return throughout budgetary and economic cycles. The Agency still holds Credit Suisse Certificates of Deposits in the amount of \$0.75 million maturing on March 2023. Credit Suisse has been the subject of negative headlines with its stock price under pressure and credit spreads widening. PFM and Agency staff continue to monitor the situation and remain comfortable continuing holding the existing position in the Agency portfolio.

Table 1 below represents the unrestricted Agency investment portfolio by authorized investment and duration with a total portfolio amount of \$272.3 million. The Agency portfolio excludes cash and restricted deposits in the amount of \$225.0 million held by member agencies and with fiscal agents, including \$74.1 million in capitalized interest and debt proceeds for the RP-5 Expansion Project.

The Agency's unrestricted investment portfolio yield in December 2022 was 2.573 percent, an increase of 0.173 percent compared to the November 2022 yield of 2.400 percent. The change in

yield can be attributed to market conditions and increased earnings yield in managed investment accounts.

Figure 2: Days Cash on Hand – 12 Month Rolling Average






Inland Empire Utilities Agency Treasurer's Report of Financial Affairs



Month Ended December 31, 2022 Unrestricted Agency Investment Portfolio \$272,291,460








Imported Water






Imported Water TDS Summary (FY 2018/19 to 2022/23)





Recycled Water Use


■ Monthly IW Deliveries



Agency-Wide Effluent TDS & TIN




Groundwater Recharge








