4. <u>AGENCY REPRESENTATIVES' REPORTS</u>

A. SANTA ANA WATERSHED PROJECT AUTHORITY (SAWPA) REPORT

Director Hall reported that at the July 18 SAWPA Commission meeting, the SAWPA Commission adopted a resolution amending SAWPA's Conflict of Interest Code; and authorized the General Manager to submit a planning grant application to the Governor's Office of Planning and Research for the Integrated Climate Adaptation and Resiliency Program Regional Resilience Grant Program to develop a Regional Climate Adaptation and Resilience Plan for the Santa Ana River Watershed; and designate a

representative to sign the application; and designate a representative to execute the potential funding agreement and all necessary documentation.

B. <u>METROPOLITAN WATER DISTRICT OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA (MWD)</u> REPORT

Director Camacho reported that surplus conditions on the State Water Project have filled up most of the reservoirs in the State. Lake Oroville and San Luis Reservoir are currently at 95% and 94% capacity. Diamond Valley Lake continues to be replenished and is now at 76% of capacity. All this wet weather has contributed to unusually low water sales during the first six months of the year. In June, Metropolitan delivered 97 thousand acre-feet (TAF), which is 51 TAF less than June 2022, representing the lowest June demand since 1979. For the first six months of 2023, MWD's deliveries have totaled approximately 450 TAF, which is only 60% of what MWD delivered during the same period in 2022. The long-term outlook on the Colorado River continues to be of concern, however, water levels in Lake Mead have climbed back up to 1,060 feet after a low in January of 1,045 feet. However, that is still below 2021 levels for this time of year. As such, Metropolitan is moving forward with several new supply and storage programs with a focus on securing state and federal funding to offset a portion of the costs. MWD is currently celebrating a contribution of \$80 million in State funds for the Pure Water Southern California project.

Vice President Elie reported that at the June 22 CBWM Board meeting, the Board approved an application to recharge from the Chino Basin Water Conservation District; and amended the General Manager's contract and added a retention bonus.

E. CHINO BASIN DESALTER AUTHORITY REPORT

Vice President Elie reported that at the July 6 CDA Board meeting, the Board awarded and approved several contracts and agreements.

F. INLAND EMPIRE REGIONAL COMPOSTING AUTHORITY REPORT

There was nothing to report.

5. GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

General Manager Shivaji Deshmukh stated that staff from IEUA, Jurupa Community Service District, and Cucamonga Valley Water District recently participated in training activities at RP-1.

General Manager Deshmukh also reported that San Bernardino Municipal Water District invited the Operations & Maintenance (O&M) Training Coordinator to meet to learn more about the O&M training program and to provide guidance on modeling their own program after IEUA.

General Manager Deshmukh added that the San Ana Regional Water Quality Board would be hosting their July Board meeting at IEUA Headquarters on July 28. The meeting will begin with a tour of the RP-5 Expansion project.

Executive Summary:

A 2021 condition assessment of Inland Empire Utilities Agency's (IEUA) 1299 Recycled Water Storage Reservoir determined that this reservoir would require rehabilitation within two to three years. During the evaluation, the following deficiencies were noted: corrosion at the center support structure, general corrosion on interior roof support members, miscellaneous coating delamination, and moderate corrosion on the interior ladder. Additionally, certain features do not meet current safety codes. This project intends to address the deficiencies, provide a coating system to protect the structures for 20 or more years, and upgrade all safety features to meet current standards.

On May 16, 2023, IEUA issued an invitation for bids to contractors on PlanetBids. On June 29, 2023, IEUA received 10 construction bids. J. Colon Coatings, Inc. was the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, with a total bid price of \$1,352,100. The total bid price is the summation of the base bid and additive bid items. The contract award is for the base bid items only. The engineer's estimate was \$1,879,700.

Staff's Recommendation:

- 1. Award a construction contract for the 1299 Reservoir Paint/Coating Repairs and Upgrades, Project No. EN23121, to J. Colon Coatings, Inc., in the amount of \$1,256,900; and
- 2. Authorize the General Manager to execute the construction contract, subject to non-substantive changes.

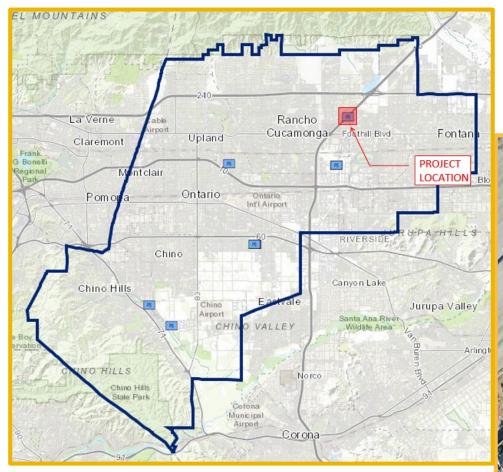

THIS CONTRACT made and entered into this <u>16</u> day of <u>August</u>, <u>2023</u>, by and between <u>J. Colon Coatings, Inc.</u>, hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTOR," and The Inland Empire Utilities Agency, a Municipal Water District, located in San Bernardino County, California, hereinafter referred to as "IEUA".

WITNESSETH:

That for and in consideration of the promises and agreements hereinafter made and exchanged, IEUA and the CONTRACTOR agree as follows:

- A. CONTRACTOR agrees to perform and complete in a workmanlike manner, all Work required under these Bid Documents FOR <u>IFB-RW-23-014</u>, <u>Project EN23121</u>, <u>1299 Reservoir Paint/Coating Repairs And Upgrades</u>, in accordance with the Bid Documents, and to furnish at their own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, tools, and services necessary, except such materials, equipment, and services as may be stipulated in said Bid Documents to be furnished by IEUA, and to do everything required by this Contract and the said Bid Documents.
- **B.** For furnishing all said labor, materials, equipment, tools, and services, furnishing and removing all plant, temporary structures, tools and equipment, and doing everything required by this Contract and said Bid Documents; also for all loss and damage arising out of the nature of the Work aforesaid, or from the action of the elements, or from any unforeseen difficulties which may arise during the prosecution of the Work until its acceptance by IEUA, and for all risks of every description connected with the Work; also for all expenses resulting from the suspension or discontinuance of Work, except as in the said Bid Documents are expressly stipulated to be borne by IEUA; and for completing the Work in accordance with the requirements of said Bid Documents, IEUA will pay and said CONTRACTOR shall receive, in full compensation therefore, the price(s) set forth in this Contract.
- **C.** That IEUA will pay the CONTRACTOR progress payments and the final payment, in accordance with the provisions of the Contract Documents, with warrants drawn on the appropriate fund or funds as required, at the prices bid in the Bidding and Contract Requirements, Section C BID FORMS and accepted by IEUA, and set forth in this below.

Total Bid Price \$1,256,900 Dollars and 00 Cents.

- If this is not a lump sum bid and the Contract Price is dependent upon the quantities constructed, IEUA will pay and said CONTRACTOR shall receive, in full compensation for the Work the prices named in the Bidding and Contract Requirements, Section C BID FORMS.
- **D.** IEUA hereby employs the CONTRACTOR to perform the Work according to the terms of this Contract for the above-mentioned price(s), and agrees to pay the same at the time, in the manner, and upon the conditions stipulated in the said Bid Documents; and the said parties for themselves, their heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, do hereby agree to the full performance of the covenants herein contained.
- **E.** The Notice Inviting Bids, Instructions to Bidders, Bid Forms, Information Required of Bidder, Performance Bond, Payment Bond, Contractor's License Declaration, Specifications, Drawings, all General Conditions, Special Conditions and all Project Requirements, and all Addenda issued by IEUA with respect to the foregoing prior to the opening of bids, are hereby incorporated in and made part of this Contract, as if fully set forth.
- F. The CONTRACTOR agrees to commence Work under this Contract on or before the date to be specified in a written "Notice To Proceed" and to complete said Work to the satisfaction of IEUA one hundred and eighty (180) calendar days after Award of the Contract. All Work shall be completed before final payment is made.
- **G.** Time is of the essence on this Contract.
- **H.** CONTRACTOR agrees that in case the Work is not completed before or upon the expiration of the Contract Time, damage will be sustained by IEUA, and that it is and will be impracticable to determine the actual damage which IEUA will sustain in the event and by reason of such delay, and it is therefore agreed that the CONTRACTOR shall pay to IEUA the amounts as set forth in General Conditions, Section C - CHANGES TO THE CONTRACT for each day of delay, which shall be the period between the expiration of the Contract Time and the date of final acceptance by IEUA, as liquidated damages and not as a penalty. It is further agreed that the amount stipulated for liquidated damages per day of delay is a reasonable estimate of the damages that would be sustained by IEUA, and the CONTRACTOR agrees to pay such liquidated damages as herein provided. In case the liquidated damages are not paid, the CONTRACTOR agrees that IEUA may deduct the amount thereof from any money due or that may become due to the CONTRACTOR by progress payments or otherwise under the Contract, or if said amount is not sufficient, recover the total amount.
- I. In addition to the liquidated damages, which may be imposed if the

CONTRACTOR fails to complete the Work within the time agreed upon, IEUA may also deduct from any sums due or to become due to the CONTRACTOR, penalties and fines for violations of applicable local, state, and federal law.

- **J.** That the CONTRACTOR shall carry Workers' Compensation Insurance and require all subcontractors to carry Workers' Compensation Insurance as required by the California Labor Code.
- K. That the CONTRACTOR shall have furnished, prior to execution of the Contract, two bonds approved by IEUA, one in the amount of one hundred (100) percent of the Contract Price, to guarantee the faithful performance of the Work, and one in the amount of one hundred (100) percent of the Contract Price to guarantee payment of all claims for labor and materials furnished.
- L. The CONTRACTOR hereby agrees to protect, defend, indemnify and hold IEUA and its employees, Engineer, agents, officers, directors, servants and volunteers free and harmless from any and all liability, claims, judgments, costs and demands, including demands arising from injuries or death of persons (including employees of IEUA and the CONTRACTOR) and damage to property, arising directly or indirectly out of the obligation herein undertaken or out of the operations conducted by the CONTRACTOR, its employees agents, representatives or subcontractors under or in connection with this Contract to the fullest extent permitted by law.

The CONTRACTOR further agrees to investigate, handle, respond to, provide defense for and defend any such claims, demands or suit at the sole expense of the CONTRACTOR.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, The CONTRACTOR and the General Manager of Inland Empire Utilities Agency*, thereunto duly authorized, have caused the names of said parties to be affixed hereto, each in duplicate, the day and year first above written.

M. Executive Summary:

On April 14, 2022, the Inland Empire Utilities Agency (IEUA) received a request from the City of Fontana for the approval of a new connection to the San Bernardino Interceptor, a component of the IEUA regional sewer system, to serve the Speedway SBC Development, LLC. The project site is approximately 433 acres of land located in the unincorporated area of the County of San Bernardino, within the sphere of influence of the City of Fontana, and would consist of new industrial and commercial buildings.

The County of San Bernardino Special District will own, operate, and maintain the sewer system that will be installed by the developer; therefore, the City of Fontana new connection point request is pending the formation of the County of San Bernardino Special District or similar entity, and the approval and execution of the Agreement for the Provision of Sewer Service. The Agreement for the Provision of Sewer Service defines roles, terms, and conditions of Speedway SBC Development LLC, City of Fontana, San Bernardino County, and IEUA.

IEUA staff presented the connection request to the Regional Technical Committee.

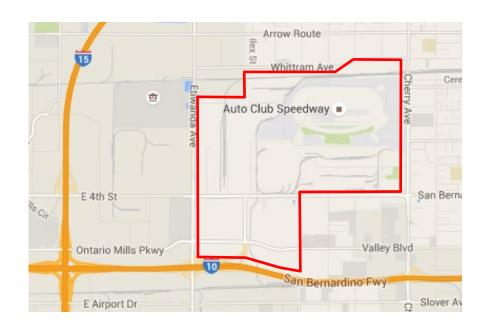

RECITALS

- A. IEUA is a municipal water district organized and existing pursuant to Sections 71000 *et seq*. of the California Water Code and is authorized to provide wastewater treatment and recycled water services to properties in the IEUA service area.
- B. The City of Fontana is a general law city located within the San Bernardino County, State of California.
- C. Fontana Water Company, a division of San Gabriel Valley Water Company, a California corporation, is a public utility water company subject to regulatory jurisdiction of the California Public Utilities Commission doing business in the San Bernardino County, with its principal place of business being 15966 Arrow Route, Fontana, California, and is authorized to provide public utility water service, including service of recycled water, to its customers, which are located within its service area as authorized and approved by the California Public Utilities Commission.
- D. San Bernardino County Department of Public Works Special Districts, is a Department of San Bernardino County that provides municipal-type services to unincorporated areas of San Bernardino County including, but not limited to, sewer services.
- E. California Speedway, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company, successor-in-interest by conversion from California Speedway Corporation, a Delaware corporation, formerly known as The California Speedway Corporation, a Delaware corporation, successor-by-merger to Speedway Development Corporation, a California corporation ("Speedway"), IEUA, the City of Fontana, and the Fontana Water Company are parties to that certain Agreement for the Provision of Sewer and Recycled Water Service dated November 24, 2015 (the "Speedway Agreement"), pursuant to which, IEUA agreed to provide certain sewer and recycled water services to property owned by Speedway, commonly known as the Auto Club Speedway of Southern California, more particularly described in the Speedway Agreement (the "Speedway Property").
- F. Hillwood and Speedway are parties to that certain Purchase and Sale Agreement and Joint Escrow Instructions dated June 15, 2021 ("<u>Purchase Agreement</u>"), pursuant to which, Speedway has agreed to sell, and Hillwood has agreed to purchase, that certain portion of the Speedway Property more particularly described in <u>Schedule "1"</u> attached hereto (the "<u>Hillwood Property</u>").
- G. Hillwood desires that, after Hillwood acquires the Hillwood Property, IEUA, through City, continues to provide wastewater services to existing and future systems located on

the Hillwood Property, and IEUA is willing to do the same, all upon the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement and IEUA's Ordinance No. 111, as amended from time to time.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing Recitals, which Recitals are incorporated herein by this reference, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, and for the mutual covenants contained herein, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

I. **DEFINITIONS**

- 1.1 "City" shall mean the City of Fontana.
- 1.2 "<u>Community Facilities District</u>" shall mean a community facilities district formed pursuant to the Mello-Roos Act of 1982, as amended, with boundaries coterminous with the Speedway Property and which is authorized to finance the operation and maintenance of the Hillwood Sewer System and Permanent System.
 - 1.3 "CSI" shall mean California Steel Industries.
 - 1.4 "Hillwood" shall mean Speedway SBC Development, LLC.
- 1.5 "<u>Hillwood Sewer System</u>" shall mean the sewer system that Hillwood shall construct on the Hillwood Property that shall receive and transmit wastewater to the Permanent System.
- 1.6 "<u>IEUA</u>" shall mean the Inland Empire Utilities Agency, a Municipal Water District.
- 1.7 "**IEUA Lift Station**" shall mean that lift station facility owned by IEUA located on San Bernardino Avenue and depicted on Exhibit "A" of this Agreement.
- 1.8 "NAPA Properties" shall mean those four properties which are identified by the following San Bernardino County Assessor's Parcel Numbers: 0229-291-39-0-000; 0229-291-34-0-000; 0229-291-40-0000; and 0229-291-31-0000; which are understood to be currently owned by Almeria Holdings, LLC, a California limited liability company ("Almeria") (as to the first two parcels), McLeod Properties, Fontana LLC, a California limited liability company ("McLeod") (as to the third parcel), and West Valley MRF, LLC, a California limited liability company ("Burrtec").
- 1.9 "<u>Party</u>" or "<u>Parties</u>" shall mean an entity, individually, or the entities, collectively, that are bound by and have executed this Agreement.
- 1.10 "<u>Permanent System</u>" shall mean that certain gravity sewer pipe for the transmission of wastewater designed, constructed, owned and operated by IEUA as depicted on <u>Exhibit "B"</u> of this Agreement.
- 1.11 "<u>Prologis</u>" shall mean PAC Operating Limited Partnership, a Delaware limited partnership, and CCG Ontario Operations, LLC collectively.

- 1.12 "Ordinance No. 111" shall mean the regulations governing the collection, treatment, and disposal of sewage to the IEUA Regional Sewerage System, as amended from time to time.
- 1.13 "Related Contracts" shall mean the following contracts: (a) this Agreement, (b) the Speedway Agreement, (c) the Agreement for the Provision of Sewer and Recycled Water Service between IEUA, the City, the Water Company (defined below) and CSI dated November 24, 2015, (d) the Agreement for the Provision of Sewer Service between IEUA, the City, and Prologis (defined above) dated November 24, 2015, and (e) the Memorandum of Understanding between the City and IEUA dated November 24, 2015, all of which are for the provision of wastewater services.
- 1.14 "<u>Special Districts</u>" shall mean the San Bernardino County Department of Public Works Special Districts, a Department of San Bernardino County that provides municipal-type services to unincorporated areas of the County including but not limited to sewer services.
- 1.15 "<u>Speedway</u>" shall mean California Speedway, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company, successor-in-interest by conversion from California Speedway Corporation, a Delaware corporation, formerly known as The California Speedway Corporation, a Delaware corporation, successor-by-merger to Speedway Development Corporation, a California corporation.
 - 1.16 "Water Company" shall mean the Fontana Water Company.
 - 1.17 "Watermaster" shall mean the Chino Basin Watermaster.

II. WASTEWATER SERVICES

- 2.1 <u>Permanent System</u>. IEUA designed and caused to be constructed the Permanent System as depicted in <u>Exhibit "B"</u> attached hereto. Portions of this Permanent System shall be used by the Hillwood Property as an interim sewer system while the Hillwood Sewer System is being constructed.
 - 2.2 Hillwood Sewer System.
 - (a) **Construction** Hillwood shall construct the Hillwood Sewer System located on the Hillwood Property up to the point of connection to the Permanent System depicted on <u>Exhibit "B"</u>.
 - (b) Ownership Hillwood and County shall cooperate in the formation of the Community Facilities District, or similar district or entity. Once formed, the County or the applicable special district or entity, shall own, operate, and maintain the Hillwood Sewer System, once it is dedicated to and accepted by Special Districts. Dedication and acceptance of the Hillwood Sewer System by Special Districts shall be a condition precedent to connection of the Hillwood Sewer System to the Permanent System.
 - (c) **Operations and Maintenance -** From and after dedication of the Hillwood Sewer System by Hillwood to and acceptance by Special Districts, Special

Districts shall operate and maintain the Hillwood Sewer System. The operation and maintenance of the Hillwood Sewer System shall include, but is not limited to the following:

- (i) Ongoing collection system cleaning, inspection, monitoring, compliance, and reporting to ensure proper maintenance, of the Hillwood Sewer System to minimize sanitary sewer overflows. Special Districts shall be fully responsible for managing any sanitary sewer overflows and shall report any sanitary sewer overflows directly to the pertinent regulatory agencies.
- (ii) In the event of planned expansion of the Hillwood Sewer System, provide City and IEUA with notice and reasonable information for growth forecasting purposes.
- (d) Pretreatment and Source Control Pretreatment and source control equipment and measures to ensure that wastewater discharged to the Permanent System meets the requirements of IEUA's Regional Wastewater Ordinance and the requirements of IEUA's Regional Pretreatment and Source Control program shall be the responsibility of the property owners/business owners within the Hillwood Commerce Center Development. City of Fontana shall not be responsible for assisting Special Districts with enforcement of the local and federal pretreatment and source control regulations. The Special Districts shall have pretreatment and source control program authority for inspections and monitoring over users discharging to the Permanent System. Individual property owners and/or tenants will be subject to all applicable rules and regulations, including those of Special Districts and IEUA for sewer service and must supply information on Special Districts wastewater survey.
- (e) **Waste Regulation** The Permanent System is to be used for domestic waste water only and Special Districts operating and maintaining the Hillwood Sewer System shall ensure that the wastewater from the Hillwood Sewer System discharging into the Permanent System shall be in compliance with all applicable local, state, and federal laws, ordinances, and regulations, including those contained in the Ordinance No. 111 as set forth in <u>Exhibit "C"</u> attached hereto. IEUA may request additional information from Special Districts at any time to ensure compliance is being met.
- 2.3 <u>Connection Fees</u>. Hillwood shall be required to pay sewer connection fees ("IEUA Connection Fee(s)") per the requirements set forth by IEUA's ordinances, and any other applicable IEUA governing documents. IEUA Connection Fees shall be collected and remitted to IEUA by City per the procedures set forth in IEUA's ordinances, and any other governing documents. Special Districts shall coordinate and submit any data necessary in order for City to complete fee collection procedures and direct applicants to City for connection fee collection. Hillwood will not request a certificates of occupancy for any building until -confirmation that full IEUA Connection

Fees has been received related to such building by the City. City and IEUA shall be copied on all correspondence regarding IEUA Connection Fees.

Any changes in use or tenant improvement at Hillwood and Speedway that change the quantity and/or quality of wastewater discharged to the Hillwood Sewer System and Permanent System shall require an evaluation by the City and Special Districts to ensure the IEUA Connection Fees and ongoing monthly fees are properly assessed. IEUA may choose to conduct an audit of the IEUA Connection Fee collection procedures from time to time as authorized through IEUA's Ordinance No. 111, as amended from time to time.

2.4 <u>User Fees</u>. Hillwood shall pay monthly wastewater user fees as billed by City in accordance with the rate structure established by City for such services for similarly situated outside of City users. Hillwood shall provide all requested data to City as required to complete the monthly wastewater billing. The current rates are subject to change by action of the City's City Council.

III. TERM

- 3.1 <u>Term of Agreement</u>. This Agreement shall begin on the date that Hillwood acquires any portion of the Hillwood Property and shall continue for a term of sixty (60) years.
- 3.2 <u>Termination</u>. This Agreement may be terminated as follows: (a) by Hillwood as related to the services which are the subject of Article II, upon a material breach by IEUA or the County; (b) by IEUA as related to the services which are the subject of Article II, upon a material breach by Hillwood or County; and (c) by the County as related to the services which are the subject of Article II, upon a material breach by IEUA or Hillwood.

A breach of this Agreement shall only be considered a material breach after a Party has delivered to the other Party a Notice of Intent to Declare a Material Breach, and the breaching Party has received a reasonable opportunity to cure the breach (not to exceed sixty (60) days) but has failed or refused to do so within that time.

IV. INSURANCE

- 4.1 <u>Insurance</u>. Hillwood, City, and IEUA shall each provide insurance so as to provide protection as described in this Agreement. The Parties shall furnish to each other certificates issued by insurance companies reasonably acceptable to one another showing policies carried and the limits of coverage as follows:
 - (a) Hillwood, City, and IEUA shall maintain Commercial General Liability Insurance, including but not limited to Products and Completed Operations and Contractual Liability, as applicable to their obligations under this Agreement with limits not less than:
 - (i) Personal Injury \$1,000,000 per occurrence with an aggregate of \$2,000,000; and

- (ii) Property Damage \$1,000,000 per occurrence with an aggregate of \$2,000,000.
- (b) Each Party shall maintain Automobile Liability Insurance with limits not less than:
 - (i) Bodily Injury \$1,000,000 each accident; and
 - (ii) Property Damage \$1,000,000 each accident.
- (c) Hillwood, City, and IEUA shall maintain Workers' Compensation Insurance for their respective employees to the extent of statutory limits and Occupational Disease and Employer's Liability Insurance for not less than \$1,000,000.
- 4.2 <u>Certificates of Insurance</u>. Each Party shall provide certificates of insurance to the other during the term of this Agreement certifying that such coverages shall remain in effect for the duration of this Agreement; provided, however, that IEUA shall deliver certificates of insurance to Hillwood during the term of this Agreement with a satisfactory loss payable endorsement naming Hillwood as a loss payee, or in the case of any real property, an additional insured, such endorsements to contain a waiver of warranties. All certificates of insurance shall state that prior to cancellation, non-renewal or any material change, thirty (30) calendar days written notice shall be given to IEUA. Failure of IEUA or Hillwood to enforce the minimum insurance requirements listed above shall not relieve Hillwood or IEUA of responsibility for maintaining these coverages.
- 4.3 <u>Occurrence Policy</u>. All insurance required hereunder shall provide insurance for occurrences from the Effective Date hereof throughout the later of the expiration or termination hereof.

V. INDEMNITY

5.1 <u>Indemnification by Hillwood</u>. Hillwood shall fully indemnify, save harmless, and defend IEUA, County, the Community Facilities District and any of their officers, directors, employees, contractors, and agents or assignees from and against any and all costs, claims, and expenses incurred by such parties in connection with or arising from any claim by a third-party for physical damage to or physical destruction of property, or death of or bodily injury to any person, but only to the extent caused by the negligence, gross negligence, or willful misconduct of Hillwood or it agents or employees or others under the control of Hillwood in performing any of the conditions and covenants of this Agreement.

VI. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 6.1 <u>Amendments</u>. This Agreement may only be amended, modified, changed, or rescinded in a writing signed by each of the Parties hereto.
- 6.2 <u>Interpretation</u>. The language of this Agreement shall not be construed for or against any Party, as each Party has participated in the drafting of this Agreement and had the opportunity

to have its counsel review it. Whenever the context and construction so requires, all words used in the singular shall be deemed to be used in the plural, all masculine shall include the feminine and neuter, and vice-versa. Unless the context otherwise requires, references herein: (i) to Sections and Exhibits mean the Sections of and the Exhibits attached to this Agreement; and (ii) to an agreement, instrument, or other document means such agreement, instrument, or other document as amended, supplemented, and modified in writing from time to time to the extent permitted by the provisions thereof and by this Agreement.

- 6.3 <u>Headings</u>. The headings of the Sections hereof are inserted for convenience only and shall not be deemed a part of this Agreement.
- 6.4 <u>Partial Invalidity</u>. If any one or more of the covenants or agreements provided in this Agreement to be performed should be determined to be invalid or contrary to law, such covenant or agreement shall be deemed and construed to be severable from the remaining covenants and agreements herein contained and shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Agreement.
- 6.5 <u>Counterparts; Electronic Signatures</u>. This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, all or any of which shall be regarded for all purposes as one original and shall constitute and be but one and the same instrument. Furthermore, this Agreement may be executed and delivered by facsimile, DocuSign, AdobeSign or other electronic transmission. The Parties intend that faxed or electronic (*e.g.*, .pdf format) signatures constitute original signatures and that a faxed or electronic copy or counterparts of this Agreement containing the signature (original, faxed or electronic) of a party is binding upon that Party. The Parties intend to be bound by such electronic signatures and waive any defenses to the enforcement of the terms of this Agreement based upon the use of such electronic signatures
- 6.6 <u>Governing Law</u>. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California.
- 6.7 <u>Venue</u>. The Parties agree that the venue of any action or claim brought by any party to this Agreement will be the Superior Court of California, San Bernardino County, San Bernardino District.
- 6.8 <u>Notices</u>. Any notices required or permitted to be given hereunder shall be given in writing and shall be delivered: (a) in person; or (b) by Federal Express or another reputable commercial overnight courier that guarantees next day delivery and provides a receipt; and (c) such notices shall be addressed as follows:

- 6.9 Merger of Prior Agreements. This Agreement and the Exhibits hereto constitute the entire agreement between the Parties and supersede all prior agreements and understandings between the Parties relating to the subject matter hereof.
- 6.10 <u>Attorney's Fees</u>. If any legal action is instituted to enforce any Party's rights hereunder, each party shall bear its own costs and attorney fees, regardless of who is the prevailing Party. This paragraph shall not apply to those costs and attorney fees directly arising from a third-Party legal action against a party hereto and payable under Indemnification and Insurance Requirements, set forth in Section IV and V above.
- 6.11 <u>Cooperation</u>. The Parties acknowledge that they are entering into a long-term arrangement in which the cooperation of all of them shall be required, including the execution of necessary documents. The Parties agree to cooperate in good faith with each other in the development, construction, ownership, operation, and maintenance of the facilities that are described in this Agreement. Provided, however, that this Section 6.11 is not intended to impose

any substantive obligations or cost on either Party beyond those expressly included in this Agreement.

- 6.12 <u>Independent Contractors</u>. The Parties agree that they are independent contractors and shall be at all times solely responsible for themselves, as well as their respective officers, directors, members, partners, employees, agents, and contractors as to workmanship, accidents, injuries, wages, supervision, and control. This Agreement may not be altered in any manner, such as course of conduct or practice, so as to change the relationship or responsibilities of the Parties as independent contractors.
- 6.13 <u>Third-Party Beneficiaries</u>. This Agreement is for the sole benefit of the Parties hereto, and nothing in this Agreement or any action taken hereunder shall be construed to create any duty, liability, or standard of care to any person not a Party to this Agreement. Except as specifically otherwise provided herein, no person shall have any rights or interest, direct or indirect, in this Agreement.
- 6.14 <u>Recitals</u>. The recitals set forth above are true and correct and incorporated herein by this reference.
- 6.15 <u>Savings Clause</u>. Each term and condition of this Agreement is deemed to have independent effect and the invalidity of any partial or whole paragraph shall not invalidate the remaining paragraphs. The obligation to perform all of the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall remain in effect regardless of the performance of any invalid term by the other Party.

The effective date of this Agreement is the date of execution by the last Party to sign (the "<u>Effective Date</u>"), which shall be entered into the preamble above.

Executive Summary:

On July 17, 2023, the Agency received the Association of California Water Agencies (ACWA) ballot for Region 9 Board Election for the 2024/25 Term. 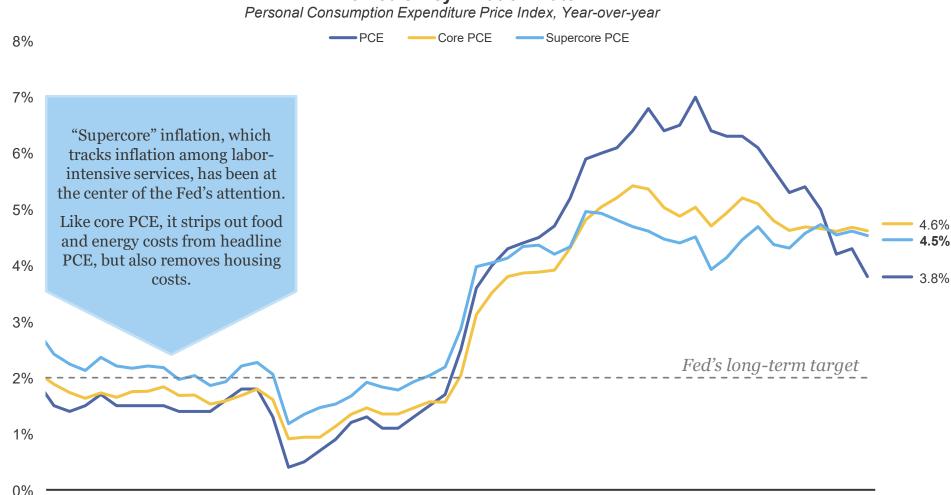

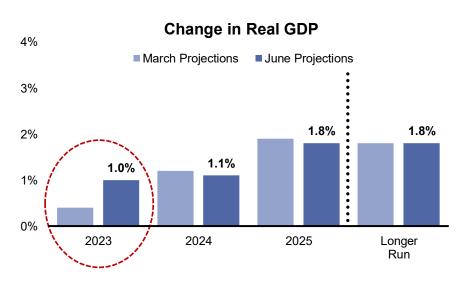

Fed's Updated June Projections Reflect Stronger Economic Expectations for 2023





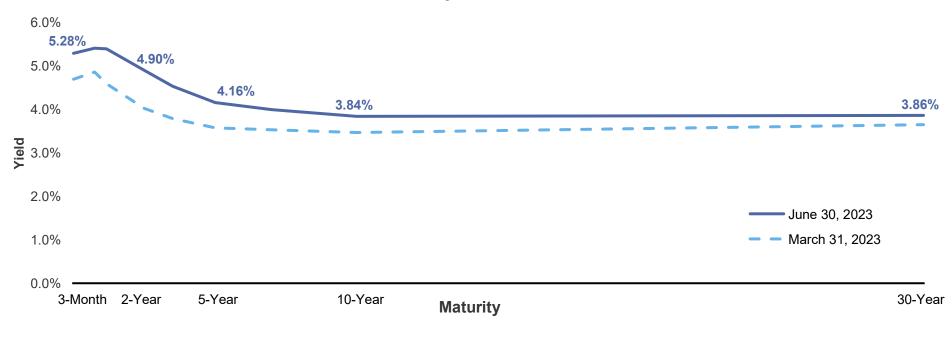

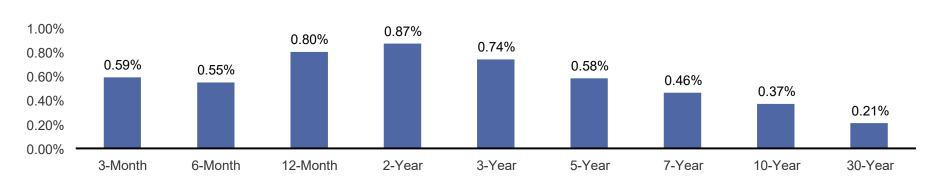

Yield Changes by Maturity from March 31 – June 30, 2023



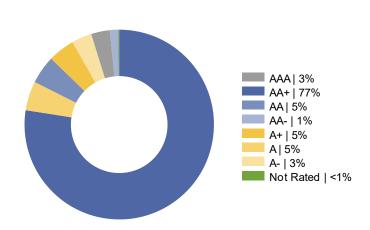

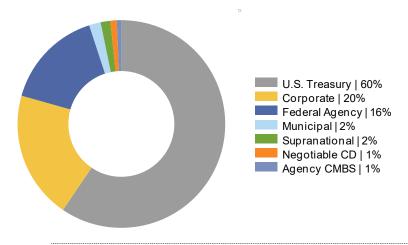

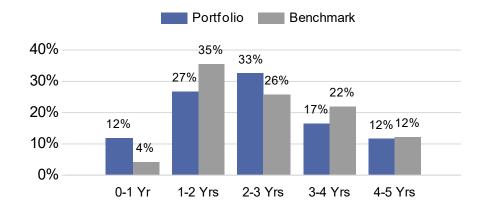
Credit Quality - S&P



Sector Allocation



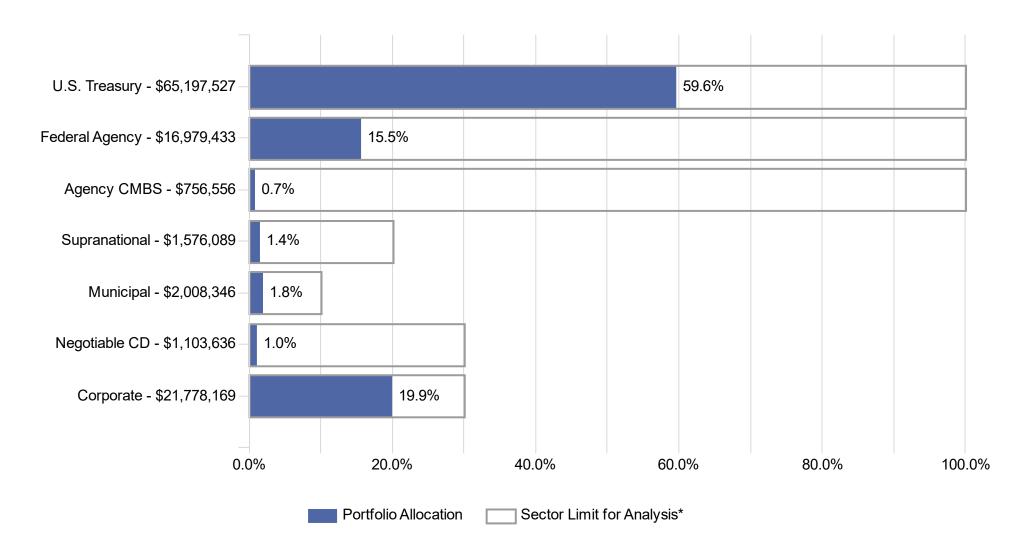

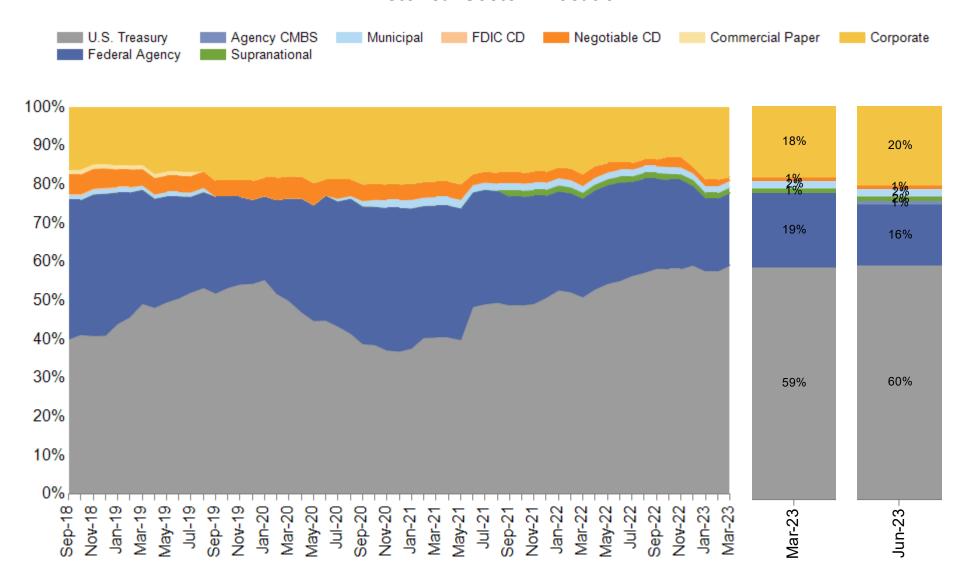

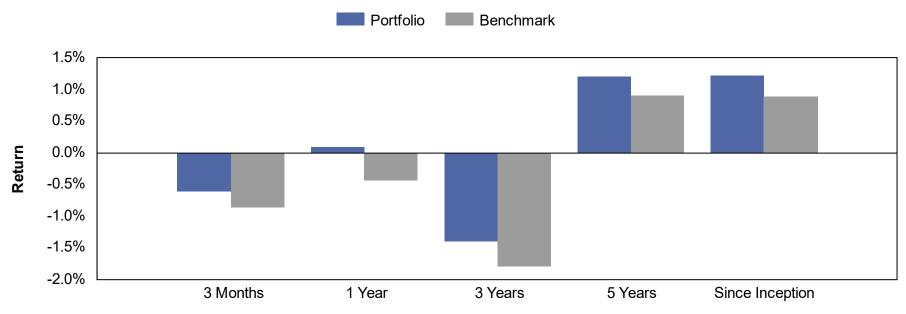
Historical Sector Allocation

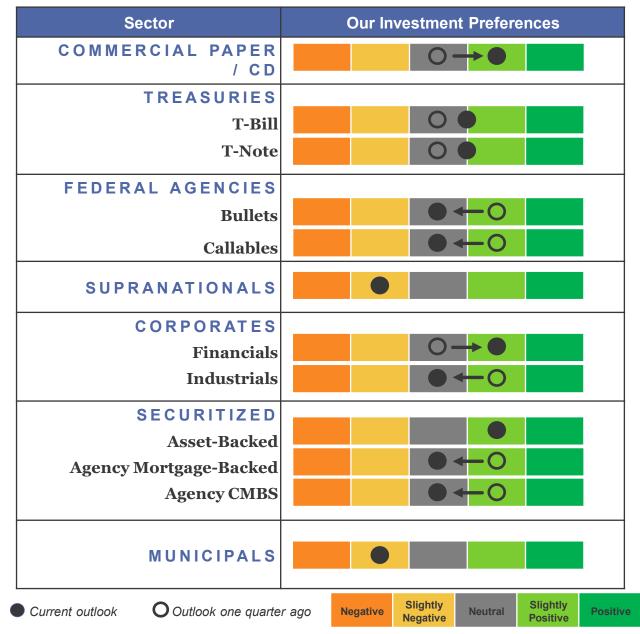

FY 2024 Appropriations Update

In July, both the House and the Senate spent significant time making progress on moving the Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 appropriations bills forward. The House Appropriations Committee has approved ten of the twelve FY24 appropriations bills, while the Senate Appropriations Committee has approved all twelve FY24 appropriations bill. Right before adjourning for the August Congressional recess, the House approved its first FY24 appropriations bill (MilCon/VA). Below is an updated chart providing the status of the FY24 appropriations bills in the House and the Senate.

As Congress heads out of Washington, D.C. for the August Congressional recess, and not scheduled to return until after the Labor Day holiday, the focus is beginning to shift towards the end of the current federal fiscal year on September 30th. To avoid a government shutdown, Congress will need to pass a Continuing Resolution (CR) to allow the federal government to remain open and funded at current levels. Given the challenges to moving the FY24 appropriations bill forward, coupled with the current political climate, the path forward on a CR looks to be more difficult than in recent years.

Members Relaunch Disaster Preparedness and Recovery Caucus

A bipartisan group of House Members relaunched the Disaster Preparedness and Recovery Caucus. The Caucus will focus on examining government systems for disaster preparation and recovery, as well as advocate for legislation and policies to provide equitable and effective disaster relief. Members of the Caucus include Reps. Joe Neguse (D-CO), Sheila Jackson-Lee (D-TX), Jared Moskowitz (D-FL), Carlos Gimenez (R-FL), Nancy Mace (R-SC), Juan Ciscomani (R-AZ), and Jenniffer González-Colón (R-PR).

Senator Introduces Bipartisan Legislation on Colorado River Salinity

Senator Michael Bennett (D-CO) introduced the *Colorado River Salinity Control Fix Act* which would amend the 1974 Colorado River Basin Salinity Control Act's cost sharing provisions to increase federal support for salinity reduction projects. Diminished water

levels in the Colorado River have affected water levels in Lake Powell and Lake Mead and reduced hydropower generation at the Glen Canyon and Hoover Dams. The legislation is cosponsored by Sens. Dianne Feinstein (D-CA), Alex Padilla (D-CA), John Barrasso (R-WY), Cynthia Lummis (R-WY), Mitt Romney (R-UT), and Kyrsten Sinema (I-AZ). The text of the bill can be found <u>HERE.</u>

Revised WOTUS Definition Under OMB Review

On July 17th, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers submitted an amended definition of the waters of the United States (WOTUS) rule to the White House Office of Management and Budget (OMB). The recent Supreme Court decision in *Sackett v. EPA* required the EPA and the Army Corps to amend their recently released WOTUS rule. The updated definition removes pieces inconsistent with the Court's ruling and is expected to be released in September. More information can be found **HERE**.

- Convene mayors and tribal leaders for a meeting at the White House on extreme heat; and

RE: July Report

Overview:

The news continues to be positive on the water supply front. The final pockets of snow are melting in the mountains, reservoirs are full and above and below ground storage is getting recharged.

The Department of Water Resources is trying to write a good narrative on how much water was captured this year. While they were initially unprepared to divert and capture excess flows, they were able to relax some rules and expedite permits to get as much water as possible into the ground and in reservoirs throughout the state. They recently released a report highlighting diversion and storage numbers.

After a years-long delay, the State Water Resources Control Board has released their MCL proposal for hexavalent chromium at 10mg/L. This is a number that was expected, but is still problematically low. The documents accompanying the proposal note that the cost to treat drinking water to this level is significant, but conclude that water agencies can just pass on the costs to ratepayers and that businesses can just raise their prices.

A new study by USGS has found that PFAS is widely prevalent in the United States, more in urban centers than rural communities. It is believed this study will be used to argue for lowering PFAS standards in drinking water.

Delta Conveyance has been a hot topic in Sacramento lately as it was one of the biggest negotiating points in the Governor's Infrastructure Package, as discussed in previous reports. Both the Sierra Club and DWR have continued to try to keep the issue in the forefront with the Sierra Club authoring several opinion pieces and DWR issuing a fact sheet on the importance of Delta Conveyance to buffer against a large earthquake.

The Sites Reservoir Authority has submitted a water rights application for 1.5MAF of water from the Sacramento River and its tributaries. The application is open for public review and challenge until August 31.

Little movement has happened on the Senate and Assembly resource bonds. As previously discussed, both bond bills are now \$15 billion bonds and include funding for recycled water, integrated regional water management, brackish desal, and Water Storage Investment Program (only in the Senate proposal). Major unresolved issues now include the uncertainty of size and timing of the bond. The Governor has not indicated the total amount he is interested in supporting but the talk around Sacramento is that between the three bonds that are likely to be

supported by the legislature and Governor, resources, housing/homelessness and education, the Governor is interested in a total of \$25 billion. Recently it was announced that the housing/homelessness bond would be about \$4 billion. It is also unclear if the resources bond will be considered on the March or November 2024 ballot.

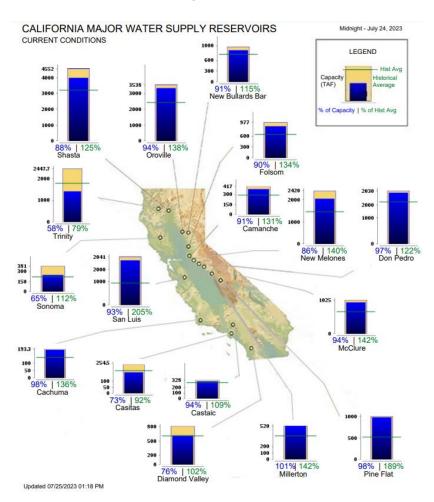
Legislators are on Summer Recess until August 14. Once back they will have just one month to pass all bills before January 2024. The group of PFAS control bills all successfully moved through Senate policy committees while taking language to ease industry concerns. The water community effort to include water supply targets in the California Water Plan (SB 366) was unable to move out of the Assembly Water, Parks and Wildlife Committee, and has been made a two-year bill. AB 460, Assemblymember Bauer-Kahan's water rights bill has also been made into a two-year bill, after it became clear the bill wasn't going to have the votes in the Senate Natural Resources & Water Committee. The Assemblymember is hoping to work with stakeholders soon to come to a consensus.

Inland Empire Utilities Agency Status Report – July 2023

Water Supply Conditions

The water supply situation remains positive, with enough snow still on the ground to keep Mammoth Mountain open for skiing through August 6. The drought monitor even shows the area of statewide drought continues to decrease as water moves through and replenishes the system.

Water managers are keeping reservoirs full. Lake Oroville is sitting at 138 percent of historical average and 94 percent capacity. San Luis Reservoir, the main south-of-Delta storage facility for the State Water Project, is at 205 percent of average for this time of the year and 93 percent capacity. As widely reported, State Water Project water is currently flowing



into Diamond Valley Lake, which is at 76 percent capacity.

Statewide Efforts to Capture Excess Flows

With the largest snowpack in nearly 70 years, regulators moved to try to capture as much water as possible as it moves through the system. While their efforts were a little slow, the measures taken can be seen in every part of the state. Highlights include:

- 3.5 million AF captured in SWP reservoirs.
- 100 percent SWP allocation- first time since 2006.
- Additional 400,000AF for contractor storage.
- Estimated 3.8MAF recharged in San Joaquin Valley.
- 42 TAF diverted from Tulare Lake for recharge.
- 25 TAF of flood flows directed from Kern River to CA Aqueduct.

Hexavalent Chromium MCL Proposed

The journey has been a long one, but the State Water Resources Control Board has re-released its proposal for Chrom-6, after a 2017 court order removing the previous MCL and required the State Board to re-complete the process for proposing an MCL due to lack of fiscal analysis in the 2017 proposal.

The MCL is proposed at 10mg/L. The major concern with the proposed regulation is the cost, which was analyzed by the State Board: "The State Water Board has determined that there may be a significant, statewide adverse economic impact directly affecting businesses." Additionally, the analysis notes "However, water service is provided locally, and customers generally don't have a choice of their water supplier. [Public Water Systems] are generally not in competition with other systems; they are utilities that can pass costs onto their customers."

There is a public hearing August 2 and written comments are due August 4.

USGS Study Finds Widespread PFAS in Water—Exceeding EPA Advisories

A study conducted by scientists with the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) finds that nearly half of the nation's tap water contains PFAS. The purpose of the study was to inform policymakers about testing and treatment options for PFAS in drinking water.

The study tested at 716 locations, including homes, private wells and drinking water sources, and tested for 32 types of PFAS. The most frequently detected compounds were perfluorobutane sulfonate (PFBS), perflourohexane sulfonate (PFHxS) and perfluorooctanoic acid (PFOA).

The most exposure was detected near urban areas in the Great Plains, Great Lakes, Eastern Seaboard and Central/Southern California regions.

At the same time that industry and water utilities highlight the significant cost for treatment, this USGS study is likely to be used for tougher regulatory actions to limit PFAS release and defend proposed drinking water standards at both the state and federal level. Recently the Association of Metropolitan Water Agencies cited EPA's proposed standards to argue that the Office of Management and Budget to revise its oversight of federal cost-benefit analyses, arguing that focus on cumulative cost and benefits fails to address the massive upfront burdens utilities often face in implementing new rules.

Delta Conveyance Public Relations

Delta Conveyance was one of the most contentious issues in the drafting of the Governor's "Infrastructure Package." As discussed in previous reports, in order for the Governor's Expedited Judicial Review for CEQA challenges bill to move forward, Delta Conveyance had to be expressly prohibited from the provision.

Conveyance opponents wasted no breath nor ink in articulating their outrage at the Governor's original proposal and they have continued to voice their opposition to the project in recent days. The Sierra Club recently secured an <u>opinion piece</u> and an <u>editorial</u> in the San Jose Mercury News listing all the reasons why they believe the project should be officially stopped.

The Department of Water Resources <u>responded</u> to all the criticism of the project by highlighting how devastating an earthquake could be on CA water infrastructure and that Delta Conveyance could help protest against significant damage.

There are no other major actions on Delta Conveyance imminently pending that might indicate why there has been an uptick in dueling press releases and articles, other than the environmental and environmental justice communities trying to further solidify their recent success against the project.

Sites Reservoir Files Water Rights Application

Sites Project Authority recently filed a water rights application at the State Water Resources Control Board. The application was "deemed complete" by the State Board, an important qualification, though not yet approved.

The Sacramento River, Funks Creek and Stone Corral Creek are listed as the sources of supply, with the creeks both tributaries to the Sacramento River.

The maximum amount of water requested for diversion is 1.5MAF per year from September to June.

At the request of North Delta Water Agency, the period for parties to review the application and, if necessary, file protests, has been extended to August 31.

The next step is for the State Board to determine if unappropriated water is available to supply the project and that the use of water is in the public interest.

Water Rights Legislation-- Update

After some bad actors refused to abide by curtailment orders issued by the State Water Resources Control Board during the drought, several legislators introduced bills aimed at "revising" the water rights system in California.

<u>AB 460</u> (Bauer-Kahan) The author has stated that she is only trying to target the "bad actors" who diverted water during the drought despite curtailment orders from the SWRCB. She claims

the bill is only intended to give the SWRCB powers they need to go after the bad actors. Jennifer Pierre, General Manager of the State Water Contractors, testified in opposition to the bill stating that the bill goes far beyond the stated intent. Pierre noted that the bill would eliminate judicial review of water board actions and could significantly affect the Voluntary Agreements. The bill passed off the Assembly floor by a two-vote margin and was made a 2-year bill when the author pulled the bill from the Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee hearing because she knew she didn't have the votes. The author and her staff have indicated that they would like to work with the opposition to come up with some acceptable amendments.

<u>SB 389</u> (Allen) originally would have allowed the SWRCB to strip any entity of its water right. The original bill narrowly advanced out of Senate committees as committee members raised concerns similar to those of the water community. In particular, committee members questioned the need to hand the SWRCB sweeping authority to investigate law-abiding water right holders.

Similar to AB 460, SB 389 narrowly passed off the Senate floor, with two more votes than needed. The bill was amended in July to only allow the SWRCB to request information from a water right holder. It does nothing to change SWRCB enforcement authority.

ACWA has removed its opposition to the bill. The bill awaits action in the Assembly Appropriations Committee

Resources Bonds

While presenting his May Revise, the Governor and his administration indicated support for a resources bond. Though they have offered no details on how large of a bond they are interested in or which ballot, March or November 2024 they continue to support the concept of a resources bond in 2024. Recently, the Administration has indicated that they are interested in three bonds for 2024: Housing/Homelessness, Resources and Education. The total for all three bonds is \$25B and the Governor has already announced agreement on a \$4 billion housing/homelessness bond. No further details on the education or resources bonds have been discussed.

This has turned attention to the two resources bonds moving through the legislature.

AB 1567 (Garcia) is a \$15B bond that includes the following categories that might be of interest to IEUA:

- \$300M for recycled water
- \$100M for brackish desal, seawater desal, contaminant and salt removal, salinity management projects.
- \$200M for projects adopted in an integrated regional water management plan that respond to climate change and contribute to regional water security.

SB 867 (Allen) is also a \$15B bond and contains the following categories of interest to IEUA:

- \$300M for recycled water
- \$300M for direct expenditures related to integrated regional water management
- \$100M for projects related to contaminant and salt removal projects
- \$300M for WSIP

• \$250M for regional conveyance projects that improve regional or interregional water supply or water supply reliability.

Both measures are moving through the process. If the decision is to put a bond on the March 2024 ballot, it would need to be passed by the time the Legislature leaves in September. For the November 2024 ballot, bonds won't need to pass until summer of 2024.

Legislation

The Legislature is fast approaching the end of the first year of the two-year session. All bills that are still moving have passed out of their second house policy committees and are awaiting action from the Appropriations Committees. The Appropriations Committee "Suspense Files" will be considered on August 31.

PFAS

The three PFAS bills moving through the Legislature this year have passed out of the Assembly and are in the Senate for policy consideration. AB 727 (Weber) is sponsored by CASA and would prohibit PFAS in cleaning products. AB 1423 (Schiavo) would prohibit PFAS in artificial turf. AB 246 (Schiavo) would ban PFAS in menstrual products. They have all taken amendments to appease opponents, but are all still moving and await action in the Senate Appropriations Committee.

AB 727 has taken five sets of amendments to keep moving through the process after facing opposition from the Housing & Commercial Products Association and the California Manufacturers and Technology Association. They are mostly concerned about how the bill would impact polish or floor maintenance products, noting that these products are critical to mitigate wear and tear and extend the life of flooring. The latest set of amendments require a written warning to any retailer selling cleaning products with PFAS and allows them 30 days to remove stock from their shelves, if not sold. The measure passed the Senate Environmental Quality Committee and Judiciary Committee and is now in Senate Appropriations.

SB 754 (Cortese) aims to promote onsite reuse and dual plumbing in residential and commercial buildings. Recent amendments from the Assembly Environmental Safety & Toxic Materials Committee remove the "mandatory" part of the operative language that would require the Building Standards Commission and the Department of Housing and Community Development to develop voluntary and mandatory standards for onsite reuse- aka dual plumbing of new residential and commercial properties. Recent amendments also remove the requirement on the BSC and DHC to include standards for the residential onsite treatment of blackwater. With the amendments taken, WateReuse, CA Municipal Utilities Association, CA Assn. of Sanitation Agencies and CA Special Districts Assn. have all removed their opposition to the bill.

SB 366 (Caballero) is California Municipal Utilities Association and Western Municipal Water District's bill to establish a target of producing ten million-acre feet of new water by 2040, through the California Water Plan. The bill unanimously passed the Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee and passed 40-0 off the Senate floor. The measure struggled in the Assembly, receiving untenable amendment requirements by the Water, Parks and Wildlife Committee. Rather than take unfavorable amendments, the author and sponsor decided to hold the bill as a two-year bill.

AB 1216 (Muratsuchi) is a bill that would require fence line monitoring of emissions at Hyperion Wastewater Treatment Plant. The bill is opposed by CASA and some in the water community because it is a dangerous precedent for the legislature, rather than an air quality board, to mandate any type of emissions monitoring for a specific facility. While the bill hasn't been amended since the end of April, it is believed that the author is going to take amendments in Senate Appropriations Committee that would alleviate the concerns of the water community. The final details are still getting worked out.

Executive Summary:

The Treasurer's Report of Financial Affairs for the month ended June 30, 2023 is submitted in a format consistent with the State requirements.

For the month of June 2023, total cash, investments, and restricted deposits of \$389,251,737 reflects a decrease of \$22,757,829 compared to the total of \$412,009,566 reported for May 2023. The decrease was primarily due to \$5,119,749 for the 2020A Refunding Revenue Bond debt service payment and \$11,922,675 in construction costs for the RP-5 Expansion and other projects. As a result, the average days cash on hand for the month ended June 2023 decreased from 334 to 299 days.

The unrestricted Agency investment portfolio yield in June 2023 was 3.460 percent, an increase of 0.267 percent compared to the May 2023 yield of 3.193 percent. The change in yield is attributed to higher yields in LAIF, CAMP, and managed investments.

Background

Subject: Treasurer's Report of Financial Affairs for the Month Ended June 2023

The Treasurer's Report of Financial Affairs for the month ended June 30, 2023, is submitted in a format consistent with State requirements. The monthly report denotes investment transactions that have been executed in accordance with the Agency's Investment Policy (Resolution No. 2023-4-6).

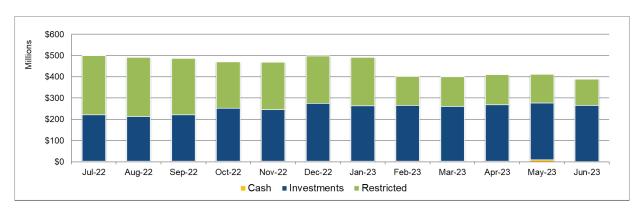


Figure 1: Cash, Investments, and Restricted Deposits

Agency total cash, investments, and restricted deposits for the month of June 2023 was \$389.2 million, a decrease of \$22.8 million compared to the \$412.0 million reported in May 2023 as shown in Figure 1. The decrease is primarily due to \$5.1 million for the 2020A Refunding Revenue Bond debt service payment and \$11.9 million in construction costs for the RP-5 Expansion and other projects.

PFM continues to focus on investment discipline and maintaining a neutral duration strategy to ensure current investments align with the Agency's Investment Policy's goals of preservation of capital in the overall portfolio, providing sufficient liquidity to meet operating requirements, and attaining a market rate of return throughout budgetary and economic cycles.

Table 1 below represents the Agency's unrestricted investment portfolio by authorized investment and duration with a total portfolio amount of \$263.1 million. The Agency portfolio excludes cash and restricted deposits in the amount of \$126.1 million held with fiscal agents, including \$56.5 million in capitalized interest and debt proceeds for the RP-5 Expansion Project.

The Agency's unrestricted investment portfolio yield in June 2023 was 3.460 percent, a slight increase of 0.267 percent compared to the May 2023 yield of 3.193 percent. The change in yield is attributed to increasing yields for LAIF, CAMP, and managed investments.

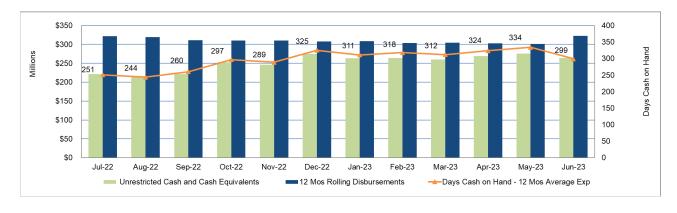

Figure 2: Days Cash on Hand – 12 Month Rolling Average

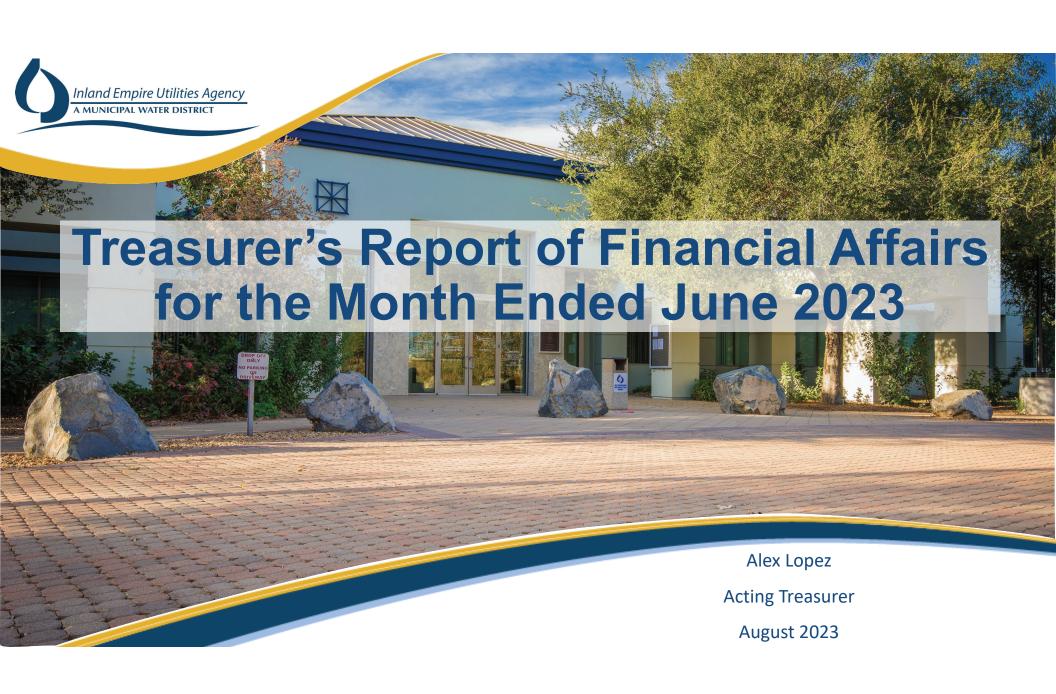

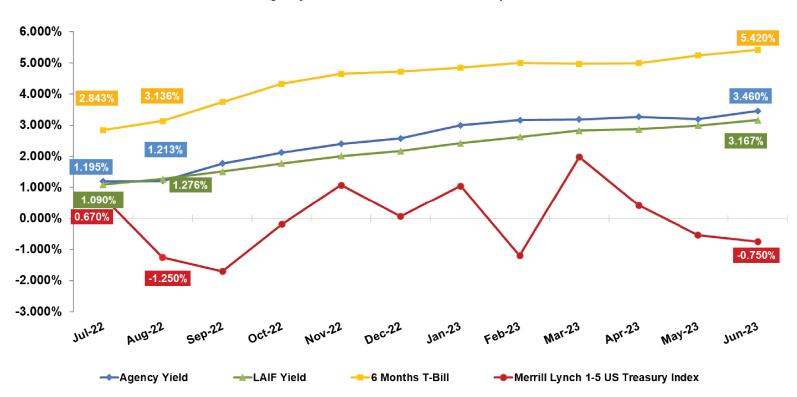

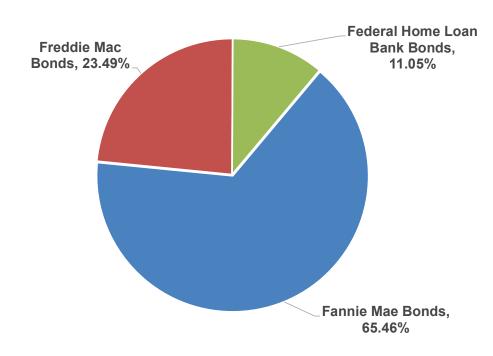

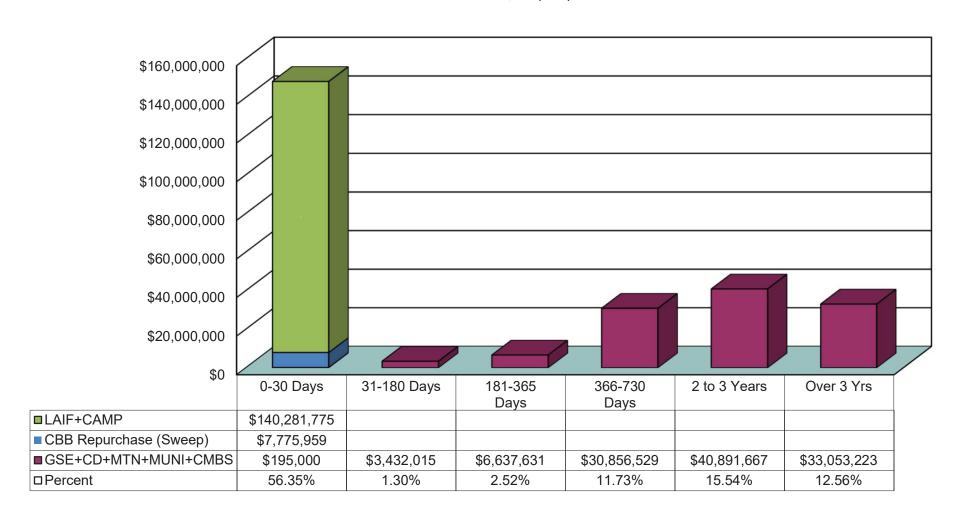

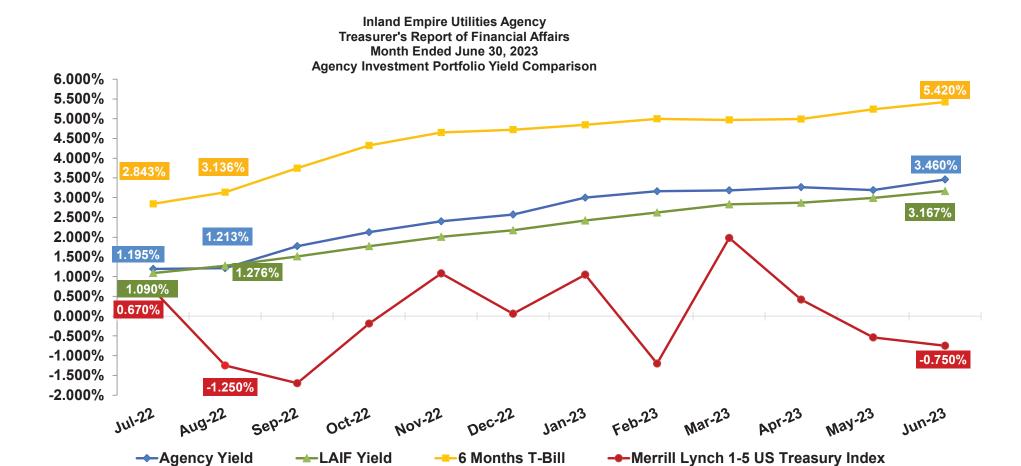

Imported Water



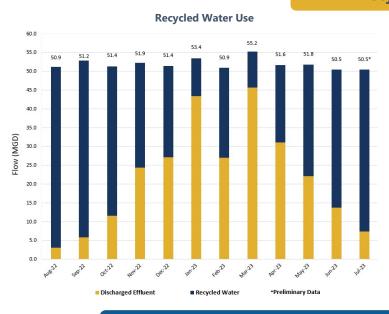


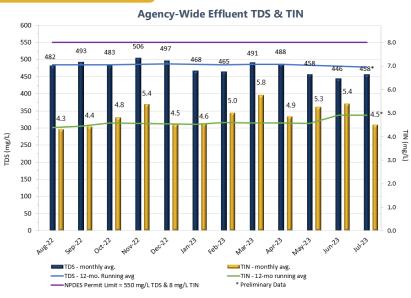
Imported Water TDS Summary (FY 2018/19 to 2022/23)



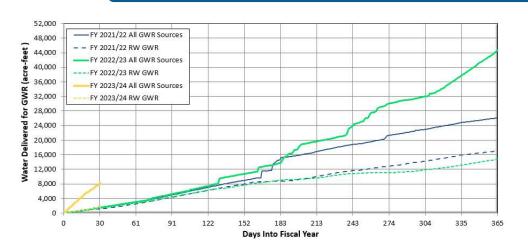
Imported Water TDS

Groundwater Recharge

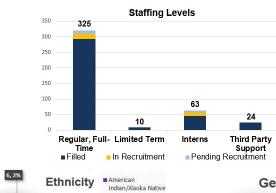


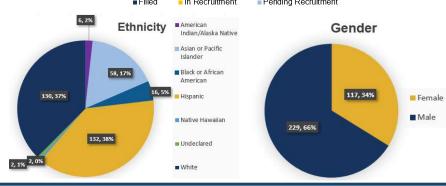

- Imported water recharge from MWD, SAWco, and CVWD was 6,698 acre-feet.
- Chino Basin Watermaster will remove 4.2% for evaporation losses from delivered supplemental water sources (imported water and recycled water).
 - Considering evaporation losses, total recharge was preliminarily estimated at 7,933 acre-feet.

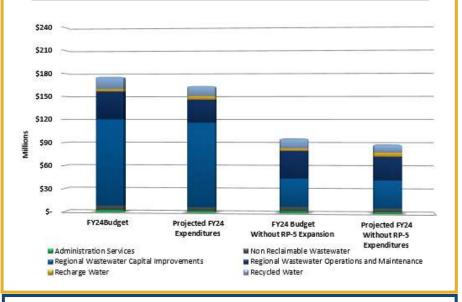

Pulse of the Organization



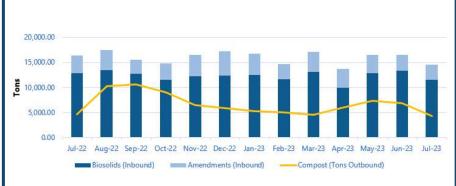


Engineering & Construction Management FY 2023/24 Budget Status Update

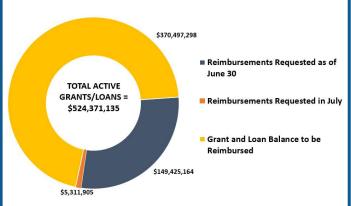

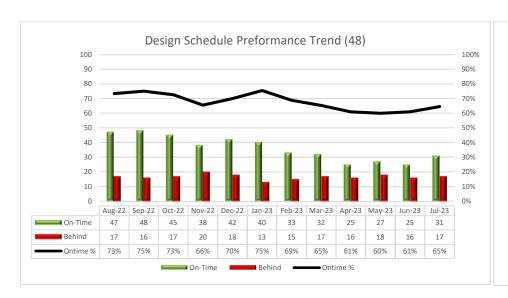

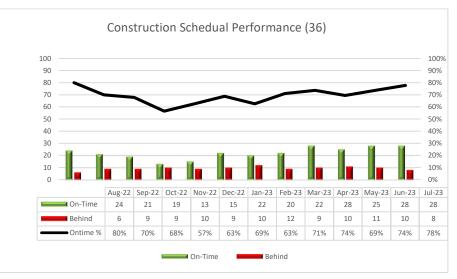
